## Under 9 Lee Team Report - 2009 - 10

I am very proud of the boys! They were all new to the competition during the 2008-09 season as 7 year olds playing U9. They learnt a lot but only won a few games. This year they turned the tables and proved to be a force in the competition winning 80% of the games played and they did this with half the team playing up an age group.

This year we focused on getting 3 basic things right while batting and likewise while bowling. As a coach I was painfully persistent and believe the boys started doing all things naturally by end of the season.

Looking at there bowling I was glad to see the number of no balls decrease dramatically over the year. They started to bowl "line and length" with consistency. With batting the boys started to understand shot selection and understood which balls to go after and when to defend. I also was very glad to see improvement with there fielding with the team learning to attack the ball by walking in whilst the bowler was delivering – probably the only team I saw do this consistently throughout a game. They also cut down the overthrows by knowing to run to the stumps when throwing from the outfield and having someone backing up.

The improvement area continues to be concentration. Slowing the game down and focus on improving on the next ball. I look forward to seeing these types of improvements from the boys.

A special thanks to our scorers particularly the Perls. Will need an education session next year in the art of scoring for the rest of the parents!

**Dallas Edwards** improved in all aspects this season – particularly his confident calling of the runs while batting. He managed to remain undefeated 10 times this season which put his batting average in the top 25% of U9 players in the district in "mycricket". He also produced one of the best run out of the season that we expect of Ricky Ponting in the covers.

Like most kids at this age Dallas needs to think about each ball before he runs in and bowls it - concentration is key. This includes thinking about correction of his action. He dramatically improved the number of no balls over the season and needs to continue to focus on every ball.

Coaches Award - Calling "Yes, No, Wait" while batting

**Rocco Fragale** worked very hard through the year to improve his accuracy of his bowling and batting. I was aware of after school practice at home. Rocco was able to hold his wicket 9 times over the season without loss. He also showed true commitment in attending every game played which can be linked to his improvement. From a "mycricket" aggregate score he was in the top 25% of runs scored over the season.

His bowling improved dramatically over the year and it was not accuracy but length that needs further work i.e. where he releases as he is delivering. Rocco showed maturity as he walked back to think through his prior delivery and see how he could improve.



Rocco managed to knock over the opposition 7 times and rank within the top 25% of bowlers in wickets taken through "mycricket".

Coaches Award – Concentration

**Harrison Keen** : Hassy developed an action that had the opposition jumping at the crease. He showed himself as a natural spin bowler. When I quizzed him on whether he had been practicing his spin action he politely said he was not trying to bowl spin! Based on the 12 wickets this season putting him in the top 5% of u9 wicket takers in "mycricket" whatever he is not doing is working!

From a batting perspective Hassys top score was achieved early in the season with 26 runs scored against WPH-Red. He managed to hold his wicket 10 times which placed his batting average in the top 25% of u9 players in "mycricket" and top 10% of runs scored. One area of improvement that needs work is his use of his top hand when batting. With the bottom hand controlling the stroke there were too many balls hit up which shows in the statistics - 3 of the 5 times he got out was caught.

Coaches Award - Fielding - walking in with bowler

**Kai McLoughlin** To go through the season without losing your wicket is a FANTASTIC achievement!!!! Kai managed to do this by choosing his shots wisely and selecting his runs carefully. His top score was 23 runs and you could see through his scorecard the runs started to flow more freely at the end of the season with some consistent scores. He also showed a lot of enthusiasm in the field taking 2 great catches and 4 assisted run outs.

One of the noticeable things was his improvement in his bowling. By the end of the season he managed to get the ball at the stumps alot more and this resulted in 4 of his last 6 wickets occurring in the last few matches. Continue the pressure at the stumps by bowling line and length and the wickets will come.

Coaches Award - Batting Shot Selection

**Mark Jamie** was new into the team this year but showed his strength through his bowling. He tended to be the smallest kid on the field constantly but his team mates new they could rely on what they phrased as his "rocketball" to get a wicket. Every so often he would shoot a ball down the pitch at such speed everyone would have to look if it was Mark or Shaun Tait.

Marks batting improved positively by the end of the season as well. He did not lose a wicket in his last 5 matches through his work on his defence. He managed to achieve 11 not outs by end of season. Mark needs to now combine his defence with some shot selection to increase the runs.

Mark always was able to cut down over throws by backing up the throws coming in from the outfield.

Coaches Award - Fielding - backing up "wickie" and bowler as throws come in.

**Declan Gray** proved to be one of our best all rounders in the comp. By the results entered in "mycricket" he obtained number 4 position for both runs scored and wickets taken. This is a tremendous result and showed true consistency over the season.

Declan amassed 290 runs off approx. 190 balls faced which is a fantastic strike rate. He showed his true shot prowess with numerous 6's and 4's. He was very quick on singles when he was not hammering the boundary. To improve the batting Declan needs to focus on shot selection and concentration to ensure there are no easy wickets given to the opposition.

Bowling consistency was also a key and we would often throw Declan on to bowl when we saw a threatening batter at the crease. A bit of work needs to be done on action to flatten out the delivery.

Coaches Award - Running between wickets

**Mark Perl** continues to show a passion for the game. He showed consistent improvement all year and remained not out 8 times throughout the season and based on runs scored was in the top 25% of player in "mycricket". Two of Marks top 3 scores were in the last few weeks of cricket which backed up the improvement the coach was seeing.

In bowling Mark struggled with his accuracy early on but again he worked on it and based on the runs scored against him the accuracy was evident. Mark needs to continue concentrating and thinking about every ball before it is bowled.

One of Marks strengths was his ability to seek a run out. I recall a Michael Clarke type direct hit run out against WPH - Red early in the season that must have had them worried with what's to come.

Coaches Award - Most improved

**Charlie Rose** : The statistics speak for themselves in "mycricket"!! Most number of wickets; most outfield catches; most runs scored ..... Charlie was able to achieve this without losing his wicket in 17 innings!!! His biggest disappointment for the year was not being able to score 50 runs off 12 balls against WPH-Green ... he was only able to score 46 runs after the opposition bowler put 2 off the pitch that I have no doubt if they were on the pitch would have been dispatched over the boundary. A fantastic season Charlie should be proud of!!!

Charlie shows a true knowledge and passion for the game. His bowling will continue to improve as he grows and gains strength. To improve further he needs to practice a cut shot and offside cover drive.

Look forward to the first half century next season!

## Season Report – Upper Hills U10 Lee

We Won 4, Lost 3 and had 2 games abandoned. This year we had 4 new players join the team, 3 of which had never played the game before.

We would like to thank not only the players but also the parents and grandparents who ensured the boys arrived at training on time and also help warm the team up before each game. A special thank you to our scorer, George Symons. Your time and effort was very much appreciated. Also to Steve Godbee who filled in as umpire or scorer when needed.

### Upper Hills U10 Lee

**Daniel Baker** – A great all rounder whose contribution to the side was invaluable. Dan scored 125 runs including 13 fours, with a strike rate of 86.8%. He also took 13 wickets at a strike rate of 16 balls per wicket and an average of 9.5 runs per wicket. Eight of his 13 wickets were clean bowled. Dan was also one of our best fieldsman taking 9 catches.

**James Bertollo** – One of our new players both to the club and the game. Scoring 72 runs at a strike rate of 61% including 5 fours and taking 4 valuable wickets, James not only showed great promise for next year but was always an enthusiastic listener and learner.

**Marcus Croese** – A handy contributor when the going was tough, Marcus may not have taken as many wickets as others but they were taken when needed the most. As the season wore on Marcus continued to make considerable improvement in his batting and bowling and we are expecting big things from him next year.

**Hayden Fergusson** – A consistently solid performer who can always be relied upon to back-up in the field and prevent those over-throws. His contribution with both bat (77 runs including 7 fours) and ball (4 wickets) often gave the team the extra momentum they needed. Hayden has a very good batting style and will continue to improve. I expect to see big things from him next season.

**Caleb Finn** – Another new player to the team and the game. Caleb developed well throughout the season scoring 68 runs including 7 fours at a strike rate of 63.6%, Caleb also took 4 wickets (2 clean bowled) and took 3 catches. A solid contributor to the side with the promise of bigger things still to come.

**Mark Godbee** - Out only 2 times in the season and accumulating 159 runs including 17 fours at a strike rate of 109.7% and averaging 79.5 Mark was our number one batsman. He backed up his good batting in the field taking 5 wickets at an average of 21 runs per wicket. Mark is also an excellent fielder taking 9 catches in the season.

**Sean Inwood** – Though not a prolific run getter, Sean's best game saw him bring the team home for a win when all looked lost. He has good strike rate a 74.2%. His bowling improved significantly this year taking 5 wickets.



**Jarrod Knox** - A star all rounder and opening batsman, Jarrod scored 150 runs including 17 fours at an average of 75. Jarrod also took 12 wickets with a wicket falling every 17 balls for a miserly 5.7 runs. In one four over spell he bowled 3 maidens and took 3 wickets for 1 run. A total of 10 maiden overs in the season is backed up in the field where he took 10 catches.

**Arran Loganathan** - Playing for another team last year Arran was a new player. He is also our youngest player playing one year up. Arran continued to show improvement over the year and scored some valuable runs when most needed. He also took 2 wickets and a catch.

**Brett Murray** - One of our opening batsmen Brett continued on his good batting form from last year scoring 120 runs at an average of 60 and a strike rate of 90.9. Including the end of last season Brett batted 15 straight games not out before finally losing his wicket twice in the last game of the season. Brett also took 9 wickets at an average of 10.9.

**Matthew Parry-Barwick** - Another new player to the team and the game, Matthew quickly got into his stride and for many weeks early on, was our leading wicket taker. Matthew finished the season taking 7 wickets at 17.9. He also took 3 catches. At bat he scored 84 runs at a strike rate of 80%. I look forward to watching Matthew continue to improve next season.

**Michael Symons** - Michael was certainly one of our out standing players. Michael is a great wicket keeper but also a great bowler taking 13 wickets at an average of 9 runs a wicket. In one game he took 4/22 and took a stumping. He also scored 142 at an average of 71 and a strike rate of 97.3%. Michael has improved in every aspect of the game and as our equal highest wicket taker and third highest run getter he is clearly one of our most valuable players.
