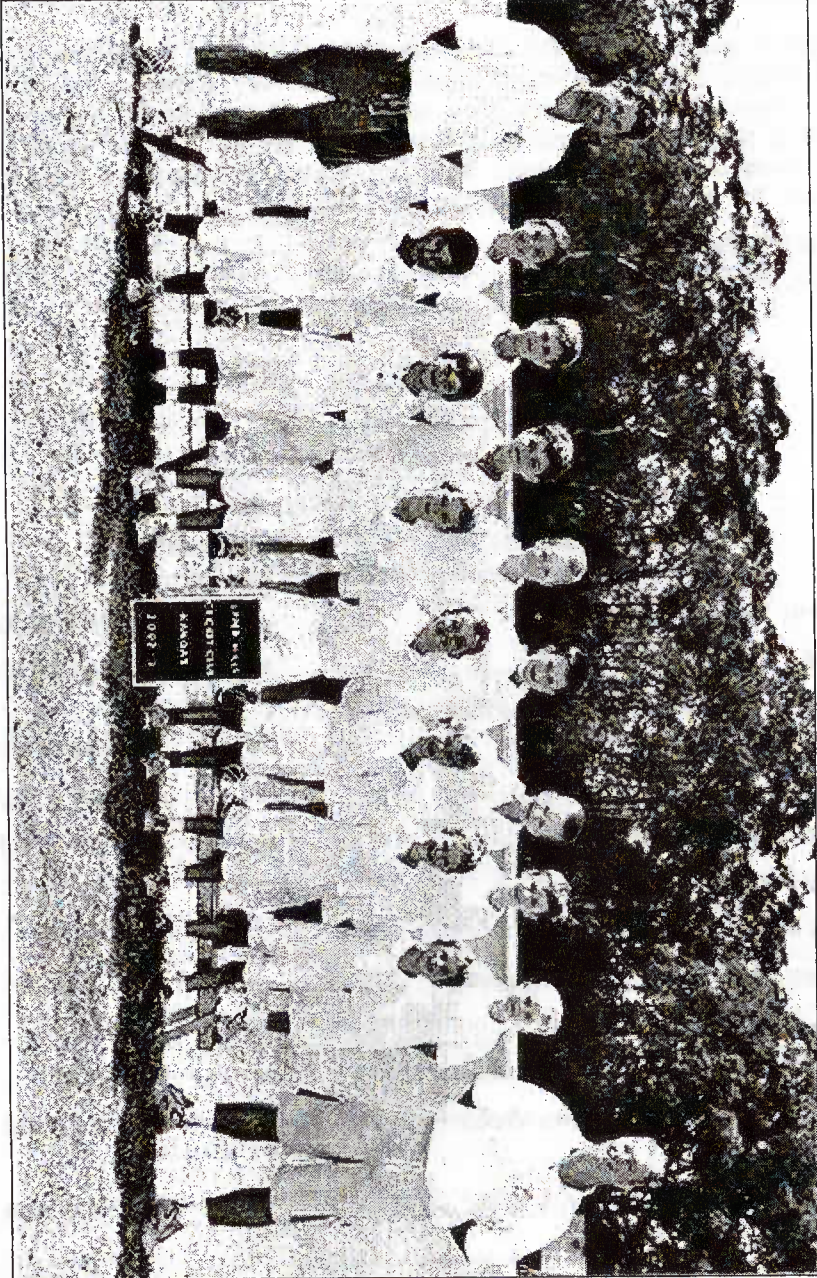

We started the season with a group of boys who had played little or no cricket, but by the end of the season we had developed a team that was capable of pushing the best teams in the competition right to the proverbial wire.

While the score book confirms the fact that the season amounted to more losses than wins, there were only really two games where our boys were outclassed or outplayed. On several occasions we lost by either one run or one wicket, though to be fair, we also recorded several equally narrow victories.

Training director Glen Johnston worked hard on key skills with the boys throughout the season and by the second half of the competition we began to reap the benefits of his thoughtful coaching. All of the boys displayed good defensive technique in their batting and our games invariably featured good catching and steady bowling.

Several boys made significant contributions with the bat - with Jordan Vaz, Thomas Edmonds, James Dallaway and Sean Johnston leading the way with some attacking and entertaining batting.

In the bowling department - Thomas Edmonds led the wicket takers, receiving great support from Sean Johnston and Jordan Vaz.

Many players managed to snare catches during the season - but it was Jordan Vaz who topped the catching tally quite convincingly, at times appeared to attract the ball in almost magnetic fashion.

From a coach's point of view, the most pleasing aspect of the season was the way in which our boys were able to translate the skills that were practised at training into match situations. On more than one occasion, coaches and parents were thrilled to witness determined defensive batting and enthusiastic fielding. In this respect, players like Daniel Irwin and Ben Secrett deserve great praise for their willingness to listen and learn.

A huge vote of thanks must go to the loyal parents who supported our team through heat, rain and early rises. Not only had the boys learned some valuable skills by the end of the season, but most of our parents had also worked out the intricacies of the averages scoresheets used in this level of cricket.

Players Profiles

Jordan Vaz: Jordan topped the batting aggregate with 217 runs and also the catches aggregate with 10 catches. His cover drives thrilled the crowd.

Brendan Vaz; Brendan managed to compile 132 runs for the season and grabbed seven wickets with his wily deliveries. Despite being the youngest boy in the team, Brendan displayed great skills.

James Dallaway: James was our shortest player but bowled like a demon (off a run like Dennis Lillee) His contribution of 167 runs and eight wickets are proof of his talent.

Reuben Loughlin: Reuben was the most bashful of players but he never failed to take a wicket or hit a boundary when it was most needed.

Jaco Moulder: Jaco was one of the most steady players in the team and made consistent contributions with both bat and ball.

Sean Johnston: This young player bowls a consistent outswinger that any senior cricketer would be proud of. His 171 runs and 13 wickets were good reward for his enthusiastic efforts.

The quiet man of the team but with the bat, is as solid as anyone. A leg spin bowler with the ability to turn the ball prodigiously. Luke is one of the best fieldsman in the team putting his body on the line at mid on or mid off.

Stephen:

The man nicknamed 'shoes' is our left-handed batsman who had a good year with the bat. A good fieldsman with very safe hands and big shoes to block any ball that is within 5 metres either side of him.

Dayne:

Known to the boys as "Huds", Dayne came into the team late in the season but straight away showed enormous enthusiasm to play. A straight up and down bowler who showed us all how well he could bowl securing some good wickets. A player with a lot of ability and a full season of cricket would improve Dayne even more.
