

Whilst none of our teams were able to make the finals most were very competitive and with only a little improvement will be in the finals in years to come.

KANGA CRICKET 1996-97 ANNUAL REPORT

Registrations for Kanga Cricket in the 1996/97 season were about 30% lower than for the previous season but it was encouraging to finish the season with the same number of kids as when the season started. We finished the season with approximately 24 kids of which slightly more than half are eligible to play under 10's next season.

The main objectives for the year were,

- to maintain a high level of interest for the Kanga kids in order to have them return to the club in the next cricket season
- build on the relationship developed with the Association so we could be informed with priority of new developments in the game
- keeping parents informed with the activities and developments occurring in the Kenthurst/Upper Hills Cricket Club by providing newsletters.

Unfortunately we had very few highlights for the season in terms of providing exhibition matches, these functions are initiated by the Association and serve to promote the game of Kanga cricket.

In our two hour Saturday morning practice seasons we continued with a combination of game type activity based drills with colourful names such as Snowball, Lineout and Helter Skelter in addition to the traditional batting, bowling and fielding type drills.

Due to the lack of numbers we were often restricted in playing new games such as Super 7's and Dual Pitch but it enabled us to provide more one on one training for the players.

To ensure the future success of Kanga Cricket, which is also the foundation of junior cricket within the club, and to overcome a significantly greater competition from both new neighbouring clubs and alternative summer sport, it is essential that Kanga Cricket be promoted in a well planned manner, early in the season and specifically targeting the five to eight year old age group.

In conclusion, the success of our goals will be determined in the oncoming season, hopefully the club will retain the Kanga players eligible to play Under 10's and field a strong Under 10's team and hopefully the Kanga kids too young to play for the Under 10's will continue with Kanga cricket in the 1997/98 season.

Finally, many thanks to the coaches and club members who willing and voluntarily offered there assistance throughout the year.

UNDER 11 (GREEN) TEAM REPORT

We had a very slow start to the season, being outplayed in the first round and only eight players in the 10's for round two. Soon after I was informed of the make-up of my team, the season begun - on Sat 14th Sept. I soon discovered what my new players were like but unfortunately the first two games were lost. Jared Colborne and Michael Lobley were the two outstanding players in those first games, Jared taking 4 for 2 against St. Ives, and Michael in making 23 as an opening batsman.

After such a disappointing start the boys found form and won the next five out of six games. The boys won their first game in round three against Normanhurst and were unlucky not to win outright. Rounds four and five were won easily with plenty of runs being scored in both. We suffered our biggest loss in round six against Hornsby who were a vastly better team. In that game we didn't score enough runs but bowled very well. Rounds seven and eight produced two more wins. Round eight - the first one day game was a great game of cricket, with Upper Hills winning by one run after defending only 88.

As the season drew to a close, I felt that the boys' concentration and application was missing and as a result we were unable to win rounds nine and ten. The fielding and in particular, the batting was poor and we became a less competitive unit. Playing badly in those two games was a disappointing way to end the season but winning five games from ten was a good effort from a team with limited resources.

To re-cap on the players I coached this season, I felt that most boys tried hard, were committed and listened to what they were taught. I believe that all the boys improved throughout the season and they all enjoyed themselves regardless of how they played.

I enjoyed coaching all the boys but there were half a dozen who stood out. Our best bowler was Jared Colborne who took 18 wickets from 58 overs at a cost of 4.88.

Jared was always economical and consistent. He had two outstanding returns of 4 for 2 and 5 for 10 - both against good teams and changed the course of the game. Greg Marks was team captain and a leading batsman. He proved to be an excellent captain and a reliable and consistent run getter. Greg scored two unbeaten 30s and a couple of 20s. I was impressed with his technique and ability to construct an innings.

The Under 11's had two outstanding allrounders in Matthew Hung and Michael Lobley - both batsmen scored two unbeaten 30s and were always in the runs. Also they both took 13 wickets for a similar average. Matthew's batting, after a disappointing start, improved dramatically as he averaged 86.00 in the last six games. Michael Lobley won three games for us with bowling figures of 4 for 5, 3 for 10 and 1 for 10 in the first one-day game when tight bowling was needed. Michael bowled a maiden in the final over of the game and picked up a wicket when only four runs were needed.

Stephen Findley was our best fieldsman this season. Stephen took eight catches and was involved in 5 or 6 runouts. Stephen set a good example in the field for the others.

Our most improved player was Brendon Watts. Brendon struggled in his first games but improved greatly as the season progressed. Although he did not score many runs or take many wickets, he became a very accurate bowler and always gave 100%.

From my own point of view, I was delighted to be asked to coach again. I found my Under 11 team to be a great bunch of boys who were never difficult to coach and I found them always responsive to my coaching. I hope I have the pleasure of coaching them next season.
