PRESIDENTS REPORT

The 1998/99 season was an extremely successful year for the Upper Hills Cricket Club. The junior numbers peaked at 100 constituting a 10% growth, and the Kanga numbers peaked at 39 providing a total of 139 Junior/Kanga members, or a net growth of 21% over the previous year. The reason for this season's growth is due to the registration of 50 new members, predominantly Kanga and U10's cricketers.

The 1998/9 season saw the Club field eight Junior teams in the Hornsby-Kuringai & Hills District Cricket Association comprising of 2 Under 10 teams and one team in every other grade.

Congratulations to our Under 12 side for being the most successful team this year, winning in their Division but losing the Grand Final to St Ives in a close match. Almost half the players in this team are new recruits many of whom have not played competitive cricket previously, should these player stay together for another season a premiership I'm sure will be within their grasp.

The Upper Hills Cricket Club came third in the HK & HDCA Junior Club Championship indicating the success of the club as a whole.

The Club also provides a considerable depth of talent by providing a number of players to the HK & HDCA representative teams.

Numerous changes were made or introduced by the club this season.

Insurance

Insurance cover for sporting injuries was taken out for Senior, Junior and Kanga cricketers, the policy included some provision for public liability. Many thanks to Aileen Bridgman for devoting considerable time and effort to this project, investigating the numerous policies available, and Damien Turner for finalizing the cover.

Training

We thought that a good way of starting training was to put on a Welcome/Induction/Training Day at the start of the season. Since this had not been done before, we were not exactly sure on what to organize or what to expect. Needless to say the day turned out to be a tremendous success with the Senior players contributing so much in coordinating and providing the cricket training activities to the Juniors. It's been a long time since the start of the season and many were involved in contributing to its success, but particular thanks to David Lea who really made it happen on the day.

Our second dilemma to our large number of new members was the need for recruitment and training of Coaches and Managers.

In order to maintain and provide quality coaches to the Juniors and Kanga cricketers, 5 Junior and 4 Kanga coaches were sponsored by the club to complete a Level 1 and Level 0 coaching clinic at St Leo's College. The Level 1 courses were an all day event completed over 2 consecutive Sundays and the Level 0 course was a one day event. Many thanks to the participants who devote much of their free time to train the Juniors.

A Coaches and Managers Manual was provided for the first time to all coaches and managers at the start of the season setting out broad guidelines of their responsibility, and role within the club. It provided instructions on how and what needs to be organized and done to successfully run each team.

Junior Meetings were introduced this year, which were extremely well attended by Coaches and Managers and provided a forum to communicate issues relating to the proper functioning of each team.

Gavin McMillan, English county player was sponsored by the Club to provide coaching assistance to all the Junior teams. A minimum of two evening training sessions per team was provided late last year by Gavin, and we hope that some of the Juniors picked up some useful points along the way.

The club also provides Juniors selected by the Executive Committee, for coaching at Bill Madden's Coaching Clinic. Bill Madden provides 25% sponsorship to this program, which consists of a 10 week course and enables us to train about 6-10 Junior players annually. The program is restricted to players from U12's up and to those that will hopefully continue to play and support the Club in years to come. Many thanks to Neil Bailey for coordinating the Bill Madden coaching program.

Grounds

A hard fought battle by KCC President David Lea and Jim Fuggle from HK&HDCA saw the new ground at Glenhaven being secured as the home ground for KCC & UHCC. Considerable interest was made by the Castle Hill Cricket club for this ground indeed their financial bid for this ground to Council was significantly better than that offered collectively by the Club and HK&HDCA. Fortunately due to the demographics of the UHCC, Council ruled in favour of the Club which secured us the ground. Council plans to build practice nets at Glenhaven in the future, this will be of tremendous benefit to the Club particularly if our numbers continue to grow next season.

Annangrove was also refurbished this year with both new concrete edges, concrete new sections, and new Astro-Turf. However the pitch was vandalized on no less than 3 occasions, by some mindless and inconsiderate people, so it was unusable for more than half the season.

Many thanks to Peter Wright our groundsman who's tremendous efforts saw the grass return to the lower field at Kenthurst Park. The additional rain this season and Peter's nurturing care saw the top field in the best state for many years.

The event saw the U14's win and U13's lose their respective matches. It's always good to play a club from an entirely different competition as a comparison for assessing the skill levels within your own club. We hope to be included in the program next season.

Trophies and Presentation Day

In a Junior Committee meeting held early in the year, it was decided by the members to award all players a trophy in recognition of their participation for playing cricket for the Club.

The members also preferred to have the presentation day closer to the end of the season. This creates a few problems mainly in booking the club room because the end of March is generally reserved for Senior Cricket finals and most of April is booked on the weekend by the Kenthurst Soccer Club. Despite the organizational difficulties presentation day was well represented and a great success.

Fund Raisers

A combination of insurance premiums and additional trophies, which were unforeseen expenses at the time of registration, meant we needed a fund raiser to cover these additional costs. Many thanks to all of you for your participation, funds raised totaled \$1700 and were vital in covering the costs. Thanks to Robin Ivey our coordinator and Aileen Bridgman (assistant) for organizing the chocolate drive.

Assessment of Player Performance (Club Champion Points)

A new point system was devised last season to assess player performance to determine Club Champion. The Club Champion is a player who has contributed most to his in terms of batting, bowling and catches when considering all the junior teams (U11-U16). The advantage of the point system is that it is an unbiased statistical measure of performance based on %runs x %wickets x %catches taken by the player relative to the team.

KANGA CRICKET ANNUAL REPORT

The 1998-99 season for Kanga Cricket began on 17 October 1998 and closed on 13 March 1999

Initial registrations totaled 35 Kanga's, and attendance throughout the season consistently ranged from 30-33 cricketers. Age range was from as young as 5 years through to 8 years of age. Kanga operated from as young as 5 years through to 8 years of age. Kanga operated between 9:00am and 10:30am every Saturday morning at Kenthurst Park.

Our Kanga Cricketers were split into three squads depending on age and throughout the season these squads were maintained for training, activities and games.

Early in the season we had four coaches attend a Level 0 clinic. These coaches were Stephen Robertson, Grant Croese, Wade Roach and Greg Carter-Sutton.

We also had full time coaching contribution from Bob Simpson and Paul Hodgkinson throughout the season.

Early in the season on 18 October we had a group of cricketers attend Kanga exhibition day at Waitara Oval and then during the season our cricketers were involved in twilight games with Pennant Hills initially at Kenthurst Park on 21 November and then followed up by return matches at Edward Bennett Oval on 20 February.

Kanga training on Saturday mornings was based on skill activities mixed with varying forms of games. During the season we have seen considerable improvements in skills across all cricketers. A major emphasis was placed on players enjoyment and the success of this was exhibited in the regular attendance's of 30 plus Kanga Cricketers.

One of the features of Kanga this season was the large number of young cricketers with thirteen players below the age of six.

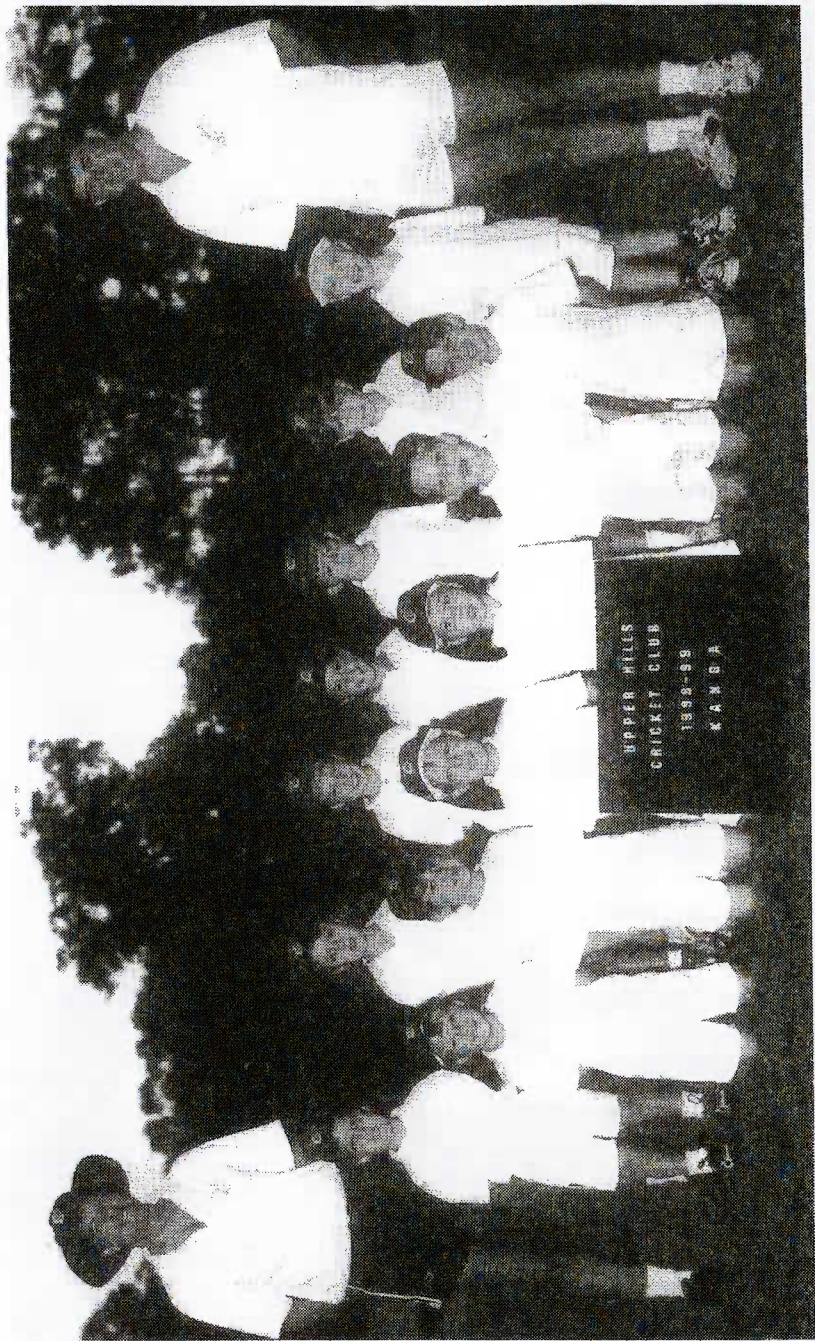

A special thanks to the assistance I received during the season from all the coaches mentioned above and to the groundsman who provided playing wickets every Saturday of a high standard.

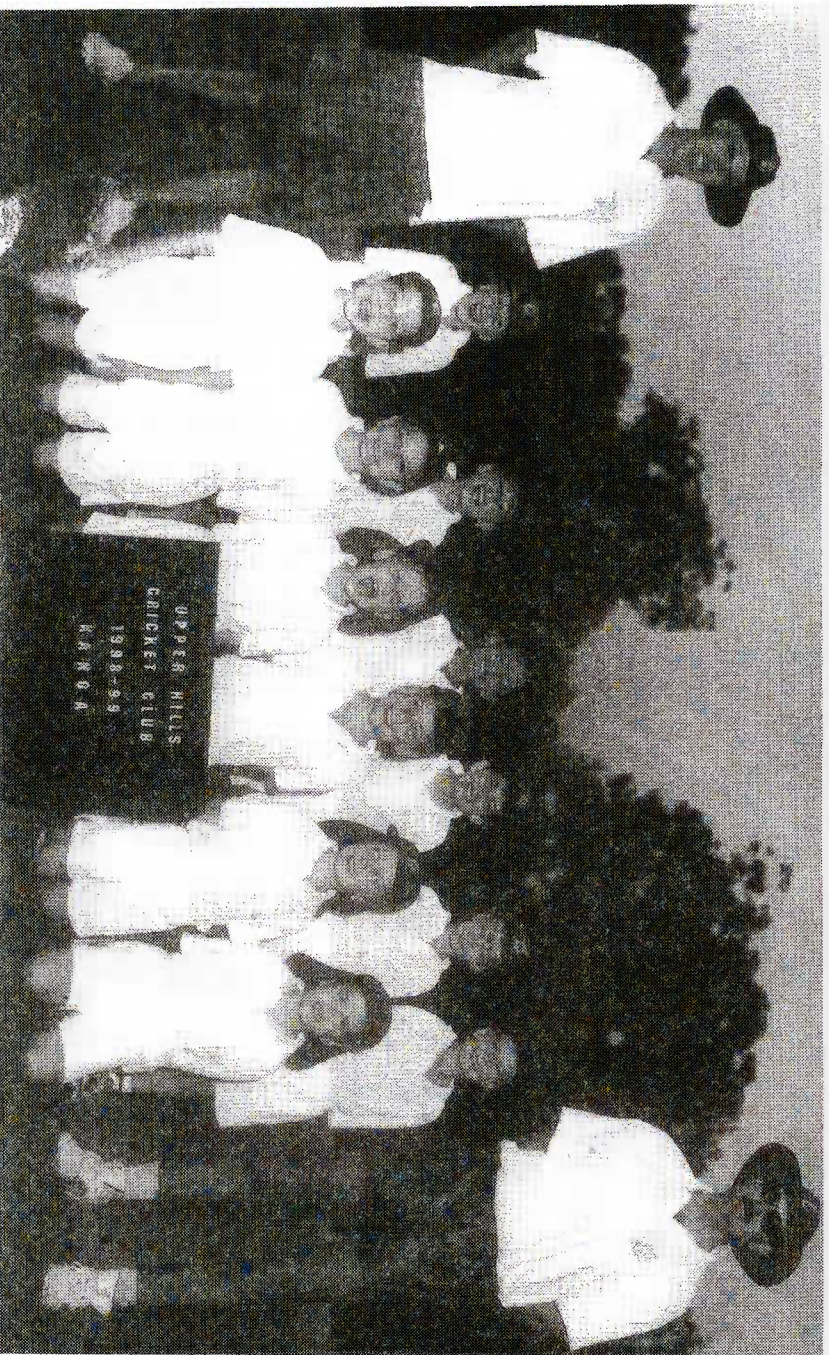

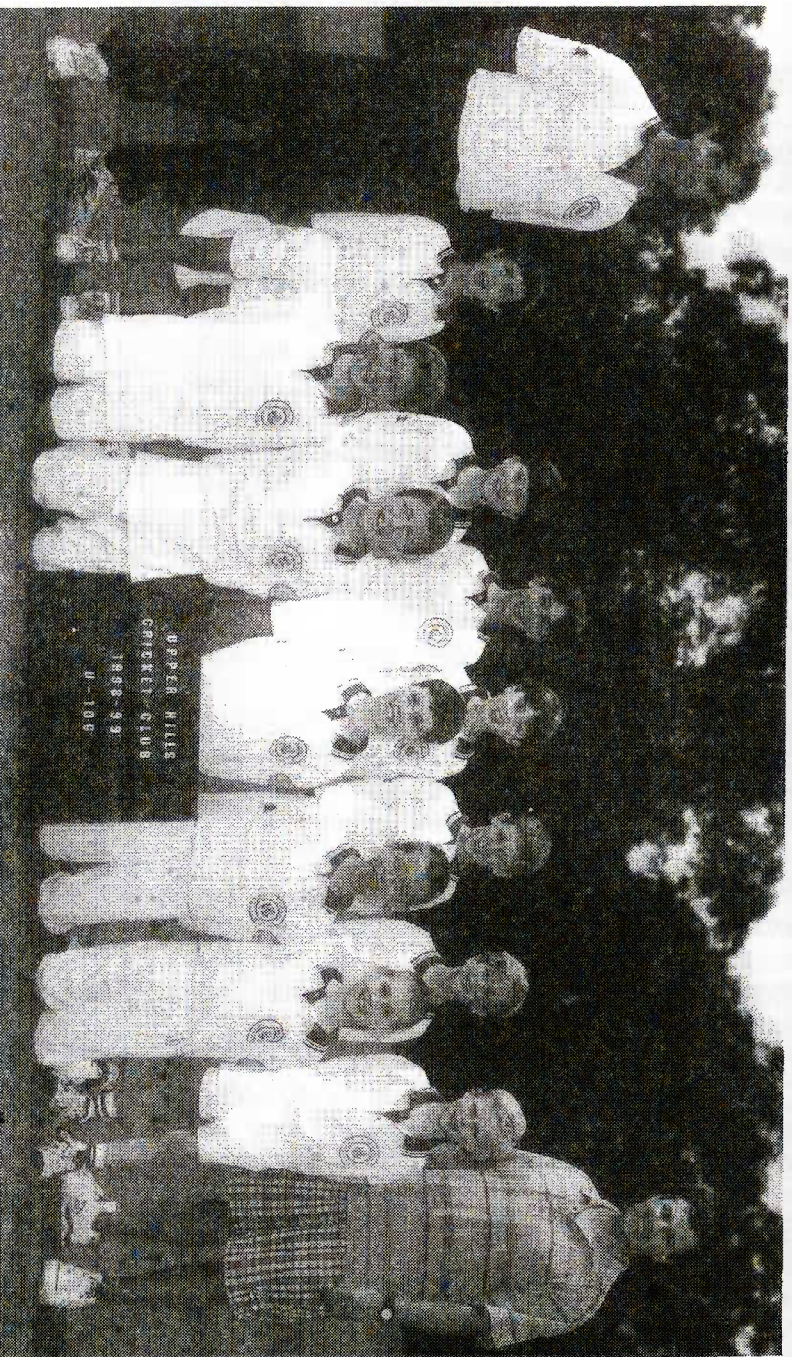
Michael Johnston: Our youngest team member at seven years who more than held his own in both batting and bowling. A Handy close in fielder with enough enthusiasm for the whole team.
