# Season Report - Upper Hills U9 Clark

**UNDEFEATED.** With 4 games abandoned due to weather, Upper Hills U9 Clark had a season of 15 games for 15 wins. The team scored 1,535 runs for the loss of only 38 wickets for an average of 40.4 per wicket. We conceded only 963 runs and took 78 wickets, a bowling average of only 12.3 runs a wicket. Ever player contributed to the result with their enthusiasm and sportsmanship. When our better batsmen failed to score runs or our strike bowlers didn't take wickets, one or more of the other players would always rise to the occasion and score the additional runs or take the vital wickets necessary to ensure a win. Upper Hills U9 Clark has achieved its undefeated result by playing as a team, not as individuals.

It has been a pleasure to be associated with the team this season and I would like to thank not only the players but also the parents and grandparents who ensured the boys arrived at training on time and also help warm the team up before each game. A special thank you to our scorer, George Symons. Your time and effort was very much appreciated.

# Upper Hills U9 Clark

### Daniel Baker

A great all rounder whose contribution to the side was invaluable. Scoring 280 runs including 27 fours, with an average of 56 and a strike rate of 129.6% Dan was our second highest run getter. He also took 12 wickets at a strike rate of 17 balls per wicket and an average of 7.8 runs per wicket. Nine of his 12 wickets were clean bowled. Dan shares the honors with Jarrod as our fastest strike bowler. Dan was also our number one fieldsman taking 5 catches and scoring 5 of our 8 run-outs. Dan is one of the most enthusiastic players on the team and can always be expected to give his best.

### Marcus Croese

A handy contributor when the going was tough, Marcus may not have taken as many wickets as others but they were taken when needed the most. As the season wore on Marcus also made considerable improvement in his batting and recorded a number of not outs against some good bowlers.

### Hayden Fergusson

A consistent performer with 11 fours in his total of 131 for the year. Taking 6 wickets at an average of 20 runs per wicket his contribution with both bat and ball gave the team the extra momentum needed to notch up their wins. Hayden has a very good batting style and has continued to improve throughout the season.

### Mark Godbee

Out only 3 times in the season and accumulating 178 runs including 11 fours at a strike rate of 109.2% Mark is a key batsman in the side. He backs up his good batting in the field taking 8 wickets at a strike rate of every 21 balls and an average of 14 runs per wicket. With best bowling figures of 4/15 his contribution to a winning side is clear. Mark is also an excellent fielder at mid-off taking 7 catches in the season.

### Sean Inwood

Though not a prolific run getter, Sean knows how to protect his wicket and was out only 3 times in the season for a total of 121 runs. This helped maintain the team's averages. His unorthodox bowling style also saw him take 4 wickets and he claimed a great run-out.

### Jarrod Knox

A star all rounder and our number one batsman, Jarrod scored 388 runs including 53 fours and was out only three times, twice in his last game. Jarrod went 10 consecutive weeks without losing his wicket and has a strike rate of 184.8%. Backing up his brilliant batting record, Jarrod also took 13 wickets with a wicket falling every 14.8 balls for a miserly 7.5 runs. Eight of those wickets were clean bowled. Jarrod is one of our fastest strike bowlers. In the field Jarrod also took 4 catches and without him it is doubtful that the team could have achieved the results they did.

### **Brett Murray**

Although Brett was out 5 times in the year for a total of 189 runs he learnt after the fifth game the importance of protecting your wicket and has not been out since, an unbeaten run of 10 consecutive weeks without losing his wicket. Brett was also the side's number one wicket taker collecting a total of 15 wickets at a strike rate of a wicket every 14.4 balls at 7.5 runs per wicket. Brett is able to vary his bowling to take advantage of the batsman's weaknesses. Eight of his 15 wickets were clean bowled. A very good mid on fielder Brett claimed 10 catches and achieved 1 run-out. His ability to take wickets consistently against all comers contributed strongly to our winning results.

### Michael Symons

Michael was the find of the season and our most improved player. Michael is a natural wicket keeper and within a fortnight of donning the helmet and gloves was stopping those extra runs that we had been giving away behind the stumps. He also continued improving with the ball, taking 9 wickets at 15.1 runs a wicket and a strike rate of only 21.3 balls. In our last game Michael had his best bowling figures of 3/9. At bat he scored 162 valuable runs including 6 fours. Michael is a key member of the team and a valuable contributor to our overall results.

Matt has the potential to improve his skills, his good nature and eagerness to improve will make this happen.

Samuel Dong – Samuel has been a very steady influence on the team. He approaches the game with good intent and skills. Samuel has batted with determination, trying to improve his technique at each opportunity. He has an enthusiasm for bowling and has been rewarded for his efforts with a number of wickets during the season (a cross between Mitchell Johnson and Max Walker in style – or so I've been told). Samuel's out-fielding is sharp possessing a good arm and accurate return. He is a positive influence on his team mates in the field demonstrating his mature approach to the game. Samuel displays an infectious enthusiasm for the game.

**Daniel Guy** – Daniel is another to have come into the team late in the season. He has a natural ability with all areas of the game, which is further matched with his enthusiasm. He has bowled and batted well for the few games that he has played. Daniel has a good awareness in the field and is always looking to become involved in the action. His overall cricketing approach shows his potential to improve further with his continued commitment.

Josh Hunter – Josh has approached his cricket with a great attitude. His batting reflects the style described for Stan McCabe, tough and fearless. Josh applies the same intensity he has for his batting to his bowling which has seen a steady improvement as the season progressed. His out-fielding and general cricketing attitude is highlighted with a difficult runout chance taken from side-on. Josh has shown a good application of his skills and a willingness to improve.

Samuel Mills – Sam has a good cricketing approach which he has applied to his batting to good effect. There were a number of solid individual innings and partnerships which demonstrated his team approach. Sam has a very smooth and rhythmic bowling action similar to Ray Lindwall returning a very economical rate. The general out-fielding and occasional keeping duties shows his versatility as a well rounded cricketer. Sam has shown a maturity to cricket that has helped him perform well not only individually, but also in helping his fellow team members around him.

Lucas Pearce – Lucas is a well skilled athlete. His bowling style is akin to Jeff Thomson, fast and imposing, which saw him take out the team honours for best bowling average. Lucas has a maturity and natural leadership potential enabling him to effectively organise the team on the field. As one of the more senior players, Lucas provides good support to the newer and younger players. His cricketing ability flows into his out-fielding which has seen him take a number of sharp run-out chances. Lucas has also improved in his batting by backing his abilities and placing a high value to his wicket.

Daniel Pieris – Daniel has shown himself to be a very determined individual. Quite often a game breaker (not unlike Doug Walters) with his bowling, he has taken a number of key wickets at times to inject a boost to the team morale. His success is shown through him having the second highest wicket aggregate for the team. His maturity in working with his batting partners reflects his desire to perform and his team-centred approach. Harry has worked hard on his bowling, taking a number of wickets, and also applied himself to his general out-fielding throughout the season.

**Dylan Wilson** – Dylan possesses a sharpness and awareness in all facets of the game. He has the glove-work of a Rodney Marsh and a very good aptitude for keeping wicket. Dylan is a very steady and economic bowler and is very enthusiastic and involved in the field. His batting style has the makings of a Ricky Ponting, watchful early on and building to allow free-flowing shot-making as the innings progresses. His success is reflected in his team high batting average and aggregate. Dylan is a very good all-round cricketer with a good cricketing mind.

Daniel Casatto – Daniel started the season with the team and later joined the other Upper Hills U11 team. Daniel applied himself to his cricket with great enthusiasm, eager to improve and do well. His batting was positive and without fear and his bowling was fluid. Daniel's contribution to the team, although short in time was well matched with his attitude and team approach.
