

DAVID LEA

This match is being conducted to celebrate David Lea's achievement of playing for 50 consecutive seasons for Kenthurst Cricket Club in the Senior Competition run by the Hornsby – Ku-ring-gai & Hills District Cricket Association (formed 1926). No one else has achieved this milestone playing for one Club.

David played his first match on 11 and 18 September 1965 in C2 Grade for Kenthurst against Arcadia at Kenthurst Park, a match which Kenthurst won outright by six wickets. It was played on a malthoid pitch on the site of the present turf ground which was opened in 1981. At the time David was two months short of his 14th birthday.

During this half-century David has chalked up no fewer than 13,257 runs and has taken 428 wickets and held 360 catches. In the last 25 years he has made half as many runs again playing in the Kenthurst Winter Competition, in the S.C.A. Masters Competition, for Kenthurst Golden Oldies and for Kenthurst Banksias.

He has played cricket all over the world on tours to England, Wales, Ireland, Canada, the U.S.A., Argentina (twice), Sri Lanka, New Zealand (three times) and Tasmania.

The Leas are a famous cricketing family. David's father, Lionel, was a very fine opening batsman who, although he had reached his peak in Wollongong, made many runs for Kenthurst with a top score of 176. He was a thorough gentleman and sportsman and instilled a love of the game in his sons, Peter, Keith and David. Peter has done great work with junior players in the Hawkesbury Association. David introduced his three eldest boys, Graden, Daniel and Richard to the game and all three have performed very well, particularly Daniel who played First Grade with Northern District C.C. Only Martin, the youngest son, avoided his father's net.

There has never been a more enthusiastic cricketer than David. He never stops trying or encouraging the others in his team. He has long been known as "Mr Cricket" around Kenthurst and is very well-known throughout the Hornsby Association.

The voluntary work he has done for the Kenthurst Club and the Association is legendary. He has coached junior teams on Saturday mornings for over 20 years and he has managed representative teams. He has been on all sorts of committees, including the Kenthurst Park Committee, for many years. He was President of the Club for three years and Vice-President for ten years.

David was made a Life Member of Kenthurst C.C. in 1985; in 2000 he was awarded an Australian Sports Medal by the Federal Government and in 2003 he was awarded a Fuggle Medal by the Association for his great contribution.

He has always put his hand in his pocket for the Club and provided his building skills and was a big part of the enterprise to create the turf wicket, to build the pavilion and to redevelop Holland Park which had fallen into disuse.

He would also be the first to acknowledge the enormous encouragement and forbearance of his wonderful wife, Leonie, in allowing him free rein to indulge his great love for Cricket.

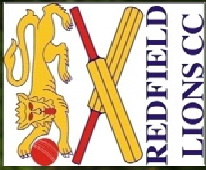

KUHCC B Grade Captain's Report

Season: 2014/15

The season for the B grade began with much anticipation. There were many familiar faces and a few young players keen to make their mark on the season. Jackson Lofts, James Salvador and Luke Tindale, the three youngest players of the team, all made themselves right at home straight away, scoring runs and taking wickets. The rest of the 'older' team made a tremendous effort in instilling a good team spirit into these boys, which made the season all the merrier for myself as captain. Unfortunately, there wasn't much success on the field. I believe that the players of B grade have the potential to do great things, however, significant improvement needs to be made on capitalising on good starts in the batting innings. Despite this, the bowling was spectacular and the bowlers always gave 100% on the field. The team will learn a lot from this season's failures, and hopefully we will see an improvement on the field for next season.

The first game against Normanhurst Warrawee is an example of how we need to play if we intend on becoming a more competitive team. At Normanhurst Oval, we had Normanhurst all out for 150. The pick of the bowlers was Paul Muston, taking 3-18 off 6. The other bowlers did a marvellous job as well, with Craig Henson taking two, Aaron Muston and Luke Tindale both taking one each. After a shaky start with the bat, being two down for not many, James Salvador steadied the ship, with a partnership of 129 that took the team to 147 for the third wicket. James played with solid technique and played a very clean 44. But the highlight of the innings, in my humble opinion, was John Marks' 42 of about half as many balls. Typical of John's style, he scored thirty-eight of those runs off boundaries. After the slog-a-thon, we had amounted a score of 247. We played through to an unsuccessful outright, but the team and I were very happy with the result.

There wasn't much to write home about in terms of the batting, however there were a few players who made outstanding contributions. In particular, Jackson Lofts, who made batting look so effortless with exquisite timing and great strength despite his stature and age. Jackson scored 255 runs at an average of 25.50 in only ten innings. Jackson has great potential in the future of this club. Another good young batsmen is James Salvador, with a fine technique and incredible concentration. As aforementioned, James has the ability to score runs freely. My only advice for James would be to simply, back yourself, and don't be afraid to push down on the accelerator when you have your eye in. Jake Wheeler started the season slowly, but picked it up towards the end with a few

solid scores. Jake's best, an 84 against Berowra that saw him finally come out of his shell and really take on the bowlers with success. A key member of the team as a bowler, Jake has now taken on the all-rounder role with much skill that will hold him in good stead in years to come. Other great batting displays were:

- John Salvador, scoring 109 against St. Ives
- Josh Dipple scoring 74 against West Pennant Hills
- Jackson Lofts' 52 against A.R.L. and 66 against Normanhurst

There was some magnificent bowling this year, with a lot of the lads stepping up and playing their part. Aside from the old workhorses like Keven Rowlinson, Jake Wheeler and Craig Henson, one good young fast bowler in particular, Luke Tindale, really stood out to me as a great opening now and for the future. Luke's figures don't do him justice, only taking seven wickets for the season. With a wonderful technique and natural swinging ability, Luke can only improve as he becomes stronger, taller, hairier etc. Kenthurst has never been short on bowlers, as was seen this year in B grade. With a minimum of at least four bowlers in the team at any one time, I have been spoilt for choice as a captain. I could go on for pages writing about our bowlers, but instead I will give you quick run-down of some of the best bowling performances:

- James Salvador, 4-41 against Normanhurst Warrawee
- Jackson Lofts, 3-17 against WPHCC

All in all, the season for Kenthurst B grade wasn't what we had hoped for. But, the team always played in the right spirit and with good sportsmanship. Two players I must thank are David Finlay and Jake Wheeler, the un-official vice captains, for sharing ideas and backing me up on decisions (good or bad) that I've made during the course of a match. 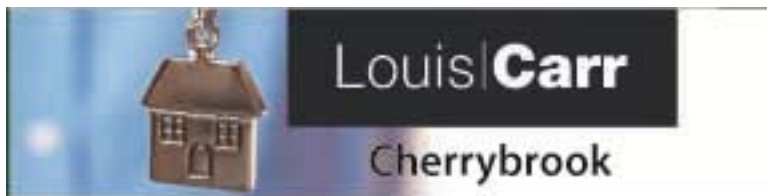

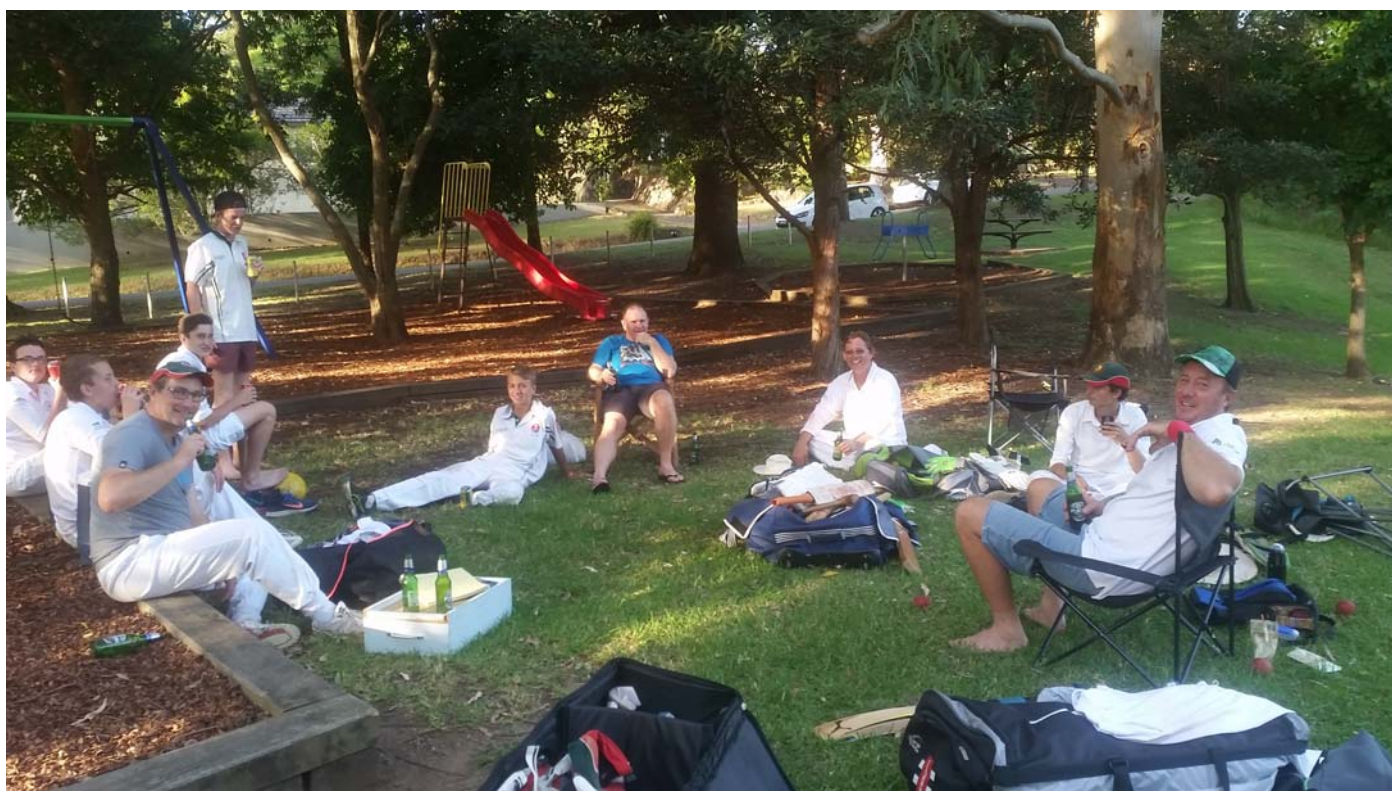

Making the Best of It - Kenthurst Banksias in Brisbane 2014

When asked four weeks prior to the trip how things were going I was extremely satisfied. It has been well documented about the passing of Phillip Hughes on 27th November. This would alter our well planned itinerary that had been based on combining a good mix of playing and watching cricket. However given the tragic circumstances our group accepted that most things were out of our hands and went with the flow.

On our previous tour to Brisbane in 2010 we had a welcome dinner at the Breakfast Creek Hotel which is an iconic Brisbane institution. This was carried on this tour with most of those who attended enjoying the fare that it offers. This dinner is used as a get to know your group event and by and large is enjoyed by all. This also builds up the spirit of the group and prepared us for our first match the next day. So we thought.

As an initiative this tour we felt that we should play a different fixture to our last tour and we sought a fixture with Cricket Warehouse XI.
