President Report 2017-2018

There was once a famous quote that said: 'If you can't be a good cricketer, at least look like one'. For untalented plodders like myself, in the 25 years that I've played cricket there hasn't been a better season to successfully apply this advice. Through the efforts of our sponsorship coordinator Dane Ramsay, our club has never looked better! I feel tremendous pride wearing our playing cap, off-field formal cap, wide brim hat, short sleeve playing shirt, long sleeve playing shirt, training shirt, club polo shirt, banksia tour shirt, playing vest, hoodie, playing pants, training shorts or when carrying my Kenthurst branded carry bag or backpack (all of which is available for purchase). This I believe is the start of the club being taken out of stagnation to transition to a club that is the envy of all others.

This year, the club fielded 5 senior teams, 5 junior teams and a Classics team. Continuing on from last year, I have been more involved in the juniors side of the club where for the first time, I coached a junior side and ran the MILO program. The importance of the club in assisting with the development of boys in becoming men cannot be overstated; I sincerely thank the Mums and Dads who provide this community service and in turn create their own community through the bringing together of the teams. Whilst the player numbers were down in most teams, this didn't seem to affect the enthusiasm of the kids and from all accounts, they all played the game in the right spirit. I again thank the parents, coaches and managers for their part in being the guiding hand in their development. Coaching the U15's and running the MILO program has been such a rewarding experience I plan on continuing with this for many years to come. It's also great to see a number of our juniors playing for our senior teams as well, this is also something that I'll be continuing to work on. Apart from the U15's, I had minimal involvement with the other teams because there was so much terrific support from a number of parents willing to put their hand up to help. An important move happened this year where the constitution was updated so that both seniors and juniors are playing under the same club colours. We are no longer a juniors club and a seniors club, we are instead ONE CLUB. I'm hoping to see many of the junior boys playing seniors cricket for Kenthurst in years to come. If juniors play for Kenthurst seniors, they could save some money on having to buy a new shirt since they'll already have one!

For the seniors competition, 3 out of the 5 sides made the semi-finals and the A2's side made it to the Grand Final and drew against Berowra. Since Berowra finished higher on the table, they were given the minor premiership. Whilst the argument could be made that I'm out of my depth playing in A2's, I thoroughly enjoyed the experience. The culture of the team is incredible, the men in the team all play for the right reasons and there isn't any player who thinks they are bigger than the team. It appears as if this culture exists right throughout the club as I was able to attend a number of matches in other grades and I was able to get out and support the Classics team as well. It's worth repeating that there isn't a better place in the world to watch cricket than up on the balcony at Kenthurst Park with a cold beer in hand. Our B grade side improved from their strong position last year to make the semi finals. A standout for their side was Rohan Drummond who scored close to a million runs for the year. Our C3's side showed massive improvement from last year with pretty much the same team. To win some of the games that they did without having 11 players (from memory there was a game they won with 8 players!) is a sign of the ability and the mental toughness that they have. It would have been too easy to use this as an excuse to give up and abandon the team. I appreciate that they didn't do this and were eventually rewarded with a semi finals spot. Thanks again to Steve Bragg for running our C2's side, I was able to help out with fielding for them in one game and there is definitely some talent in the team. Hopefully we'll see more of them around the club in future years. Our D2's side is showing continual improvement with a few new players as well. It's always good for a team to have a newcomer (Harold Vadala) come to the club and help out by scoring close to 500 runs for the year.

Our Classics team continued for a second year and because of the efforts of Mick Dolly, it was clear to see the men in the team really enjoyed their season. A first past the post format in a 16 team competition makes it very hard to have any success especially when there's such a diverse range of skill between the teams. For one opponent that I saw it wouldn't be a stretch to say that their two opening bowlers were of A grade standard. Whether they smashed their opponents or the opponents smashed them, the players still had a good time and the social aspect of the competition seems to be almost as important as the on-field action where post-match drinks can sometimes take as long as the match itself!

The club was very successful off the field as well. Dane Ramsay and Charles Ivey worked tirelessly in getting a massive amount of sponsors on board to support the club. Have a look at the back of our training shirts and I'm sure you can imagine how much work would have been required to achieve this many sponsors. So a huge thanks to both Dane and Charles for their work and for the sponsors themselves for supporting of the club. It would be incredibly difficult for a club to survive without them. Our selectors again worked tirelessly in assisting the captains to get the numbers required for their teams. Thanks to Col Griffin, Andre Bertolo, Doug Gemmell and the unofficial selectors Craig Henson and John Campo. Thanks also to John Campo for being our proxy to the association, his work as secretary, organising the banksias tour and running the D2 side. Thanks again to Craig Henson for captaining the B grade side and working again as the registrar for this year. Whilst it may not have been noticed, Scott Calvert still did a lot of work this year in setting up the junior competition and was always on call whenever I had any questions on how to organise anything juniors related so thanks again for your help Scott. Whilst it's great to have so much help, it's unfortunate that it's the same names that I'm thanking this year as I did last year. If there are any new members who are willing to help, it would be great to see some new faces at our committee meetings.

The club had another successful Banksia tour this year although it probably wasn't the best idea for me to wear an England cricket shirt sitting right in the middle of a bunch of blokes wearing green and gold shirts. Apart from that, it was awesome trip thanks to the organisation provided by John Campo.

At the risk of being self-indulgent, I've loved all the 25 years that I've been with the club and there are still people within the club that I've known since I first joined. It's something that has been with me my whole life and I see the club as a second family. I've gained a lot of self-confidence through gaining so many life lessons from playing and on the back-end administration side. Being the president of a club that has built a small community spanning 120 years who do everything they can to facilitate getting as many people as possible interested in cricket and providing a service to the wider community fills me with enormous pride. I'm not aware of any other club that is so welcoming to anyone who wants to come and have a go. Dave Lea has the record of playing 50 consecutive years and still going. Dave, I'm coming for your record!

U/15 Team Report

If this year is an indicator of future years, I can see myself coaching teams for a very long time. This was my first time coaching a team and I really enjoyed the experience. Unfortunately I only put my hand up to coach at the very last minute as there were no parents forthcoming to volunteer to coach so we had a very short (one week) pre-season. This really put us at a disadvantage as it is vitally important in any season to start being fully prepared. Most of the 4 wins for the season came towards the end which is probably an indicator of the lack of preparation (although we did win the first game for the season so I'm not sure if my logic is that tight). It was a great experience to coach such a top bunch of kids, all who play in the right spirit and get along with each other really well. Some junior teams in the past can have a bit of a culture of infighting however in this team it seemed like everyone was everyone's best mate. The support that they showed each other was awesome, an example of this was when one of our top performing batsmen Lachlan DiStaso just missed out on scoring his first ever century getting out for 98. The boys in the team were all as upset and disappointed by this as Lachlan himself. Lachlan still had a very good season with the bat, it's always a success to score over 200 runs in a season especially when taking on the important role of facing the new ball. Fortunately we were able to celebrate later in the year when Mark Hughes scored his first ever century with a very proud dad watching and celebrating on the sidelines. Mark's ability to slap a ball over cover is something only someone with real skill can execute however the best part I thought was the maturity that he showed in all innings throughout the year. Match awareness was something that I really tried to instill into the boys and Mark showed this by showing an example of how to build an innings: slow at the start, wait for the bad balls and then when you're set start playing a few more shots. Tom Ohlrich was another who had a successful season both with the ball and bat and is a highly skilled player. Very consistent both with wickets and with the bat, Tom had a big role to play in every match and his fast swing speed means that he can really whack a ball when he wanted to. Tom also took the new ball for a majority of the games and helped out with wicket keeping which shows the all-round talent that he has. Speaking of giving the ball a whack, Charlie Wilton brought the crowds in with his big hitting and furiously quick bowling. When I first came to coach the team, I tried to get Charlie to play a bit more defensive but soon learnt that this was a fool's errand. He really entertained the crowds in a number of innings, no more so than his 70 odd where he a smashed a number of sixes and fours all over the ground. I also haven't seen a bowler instill so much fear in the opposition batsmen through sheer pace. From our first training session, a player that really impressed both with ball and bat was Cooper Anderson. Cooper had a successful year with the ball, showing good ability to move the ball and show great control. Given the obvious talent that Cooper has with the bat, it was a disappointing season for him. I would like to work in the pre-season in having Cooper play the ball closer to his body and not push at the ball. Captaincy seems to come guite natural to Cooper and is one of the more mature boys in the team.

He always managed to ensure that all the boys in the team had a go in some way and the boys all respected him as their leader. It would have been great to have Akash Arnold available for more matches as he is another highly skilled all-round player. Akash is a batsman with all the shots, a bowler with good control and a highly skilled keeper as well. With the batting, Akash probably needs to work on his match awareness though where he tends to play big shots a bit too early in the innings. Roger Francis was a new player to the team and the boys accepted him with open arms. Roger has a highly sought after skill which is leg spin bowling. A number of Roger's wickets were taken through skill rather than the usual method for spinners in throwing the ball up and hoping the batsmen make a mistake. Another new player to the team was Anthony Donaldson. Anthony is a handy bowler and a batsman who builds his game around a solid defence. Anthony loved his cricket and attended every training session and all the school holiday coaching sessions as well. A great team player. Speaking of team players, Jack Tanner and Andrew Tindale were the given the role of team motivators. They were the two instructed with keeping up the chat in the field to ensure that there was high energy on the field and they both took to this task very well. Jack was probably the most accurate bowler in the team and could argue that he was under-bowled. Andrew also showed great promise with the ball. Another very good bower was Will Diacos. Will could do some freakish things in the field and has real natural talent showing great hand-eye co-ordination. This helped with the ball as well where Will had good consistency and was rewarded with a number of wickets. Mustafa Manzoor also had a good season with the ball, another accurate bowler for the team. Mustafa also has great potential with the batting and had a number of starts in the season without going on to make a big score. A unique but handy technique, Mustafa will become better through experience. It would be great to see Mustafa come out of his shell a bit more too. The stylish cool kid of the team has to be Tayne Read. Happy to bat wherever, bowl whenever, Tayne was a real team player. A bowler with the sort of bowling style that is in high demand in the shorter format with low trajectory dart bowling. If Tayne works hard on his release point and finger position, he'll become unplayable. More self-belief with the bat would help too as I believe Tayne isn't aware of his true ability. Tayne has the temperament, technique and strength to greatly improve in the future.

There were a number of lessons to be learnt this year which will hopefully be remembered for the next season. The main lesson to be learnt was around match awareness. The boys need to adapt their game to the situation at hand. A more inward focus from the team is another lesson which needs to be applied. Too often the boys were affected by the chat from the other team. This is just one example. The boys have the talent to beat anyone and if they focused more on what they can do well and less on what the other team is doing, they can achieve great things next season.

The importance of a solid pre-season and weekly training is also another lesson that needs to be learnt. The boys didn't have enough focus at training (especially when bowling) making it hard for the batsmen to practise a match situation when it was their turn in the nets. I'm very glad that the boys had a lot of fun at training but sometimes they had a bit too much fun!

A special thanks to the boys that played in the seniors competition this year: Anthony Donaldson, Mustafa Manzoor, Tom Ohlrich, Cooper Anderson, Charlie Wilton and Mark Hughes. The experience gained for juniors to play in the seniors competition is invaluable and something that I recommend to all the boys.

I'd like to thank the parents as well who put their hand up to do the work off the field. Greg and Corrina Donaldson were a massive help. Corrina worked as the team manager which meant that all I had to do was show up on the day and coach. Greg did the bulk of the umpiring during the season. It is a tiring job standing out in the sun all day however Greg took on this job without complaint. Joe DiStaso also needs to be thanked for doing a large part of the umpiring as well. Thanks to Bernie Tindale for doing the bulk of the scoring all season and thanks as well goes to Merryn Diacos and Joe who helped out with the scoring when Bernie wasn't available. Thanks as well to the parents who were present at all the games who provided great support for the boys and provided an encouraging and positive atmosphere. I am greatful to the Mums and Dads who supplied the coffee, this was vitally important in being able to coach so early on a Saturday morning!

I sincerely hope that the boys all play again next season. As the boys get older and play seniors cricket, the community that has been created by the boys and their parents is a once in a lifetime opportunity. I was truly grateful to coach a team with a great network of players and parents.







Special thanks to the other juniors (under 14s and under 13s) who played their first senior games, often at short notice, and played a valuable part in team. They showed their potential and will only keep on improving. While I would love to continue to play with them over the next few years and see them develop as cricketers, I suspect it won't be long before they move up to higher grades.

A Long Hot Summer. D2s ride through the 2017/18 Cricket Season.

As I write the semi finals are about to start in what has been a very competitive D reserve competition, in which each of the top five teams has had standout performances from at least one or two players. In our team we had Harold Vadala who was introduced to our team as an enthusiast cricketer and a work colleague of our Club President. What we did not know is that he used to open the batting for his club in India. He contributed 498 runs at average of 45.30. Unfortunately, we could let Harold play to his potential as he was provisional rating unlike the Hornsby players who were on a fixed rating as we were concerned if he overachieved he would be lost to our grade. I believe that our team was the best team in the competition on its day as we could match it with any of the teams on our day.
