2010/11 season started off with some major changes.

Firstly the club was able to secure a major sponsor. The executive would like to thank and acknowledge the contribution made by MBS to the club during the season

This included hits from over 20 other countries around the world. Thirdly, members from the under 16's, together with some friends from other clubs decided that they wanted to play in the Colts competition for the new season.

The club entered 6 sides for the 2010/2011 season (down 1 side from last year), which included A Grade, Colts, B2, C1, C3 and D2. Three sides reached the semis, being Colts, B2 and C3. Alas all lost their semis.

To run a club like KUHCC, you need the dedication of volunteers to fill the many roles within the club structure. This year as president, I have once again received great support from the members on the executive, the coaches & managers of the junior teams. These volunteers ensure that we are able to get the teams on the park week in & week out over the cricket season. Without their support & dedication the club would be to survive.

This year the KUHCC hosted 2 main events during the season. The first was our annual prawn night back on the 20th November 2010. The clubroom was once again packed for the feast of prawns and salads. Thankyou to all members that assisted in the catering for the night. All enjoyed a great night.

The Under 9 parents were very excited at the beginning of this season: we had just about enough players to form two sides and we had a club president who wanted to lay the foundations for future Australian sides. That explained why Rob Gerometta must have got the club cheque book out to head hunt Mark Nisbet from New Zealand rep sides and the MCC as the U9 McGrath coach.

Mark communicated his philosophy at the beginning of the season as “my main aim this year is to have fun and help the boys learn the art of cricket.” He described how this year it was more important to learn to play cricket well (with one eye on the future) than to win at all costs. Under Mark’s patient coaching the 7 boys thrived – some arrived as accomplished cricketers while others were relative novices – and by the end of the season he had welded them into a cohesive team with a good spirit. The boys played consistently well and were entertaining to watch. They won far more than they lost.

Player profiles

Ben Anderson – Ben was new to team cricket this year and apologetic at first that he’d “only played Milo cricket before”. Milo’s loss was our gain as he grew in confidence and stature – he loved to open the batting and bat again at 8 whenever possible, posting some big scores. Ben is also unusual in that - as he developed during the season – his fiendish spin bowling confounded the opposition. While Ben took some wickets, the opposition didn’t know how to react to his “flippers” and certainly couldn’t score runs off them.

Henry Geale – is Henry the most cheerful player in the Club? Notable for a shock of curly hair and for tucking his bat under his arm and walking when given “Out” in some very dodgy umpiring decisions (the coach and manager were biting their lips at the time), Henry was new to the club and developed into a solid, careful batsman who will be an asset to any side. Henry worked very hard at his bowling over the season, and by the end he bowled consistently straight and off a good length.

Kieran Krishnan – our genuine “all rounder”. Head hunted to the club by the coach, Kieran swiftly repaid the investment. His medium pace bowling was always straight, accurate and of a good length. Kieran sported a yellow helmet throughout the season so as to allow spectators to identify him from a distance. This wasn’t strictly necessary since his stylish batting achieved this anyway. Kieran was consistently our highest scorer (with regular 20 pluses) and the coach normally asked him to bat at 5 so as to turn around our game. This he did regularly, and often flamboyantly. His “6” against Castle Hill was a highlight of the season.

Ryan Mares – Ryan is our “pocket battleship” and played last year in the Under 8s. Short in stature at present, Ryan hits the ball explosively hard when batting and bowls accurate medium pace off a very short run up. We all loved watching Ryan’s strokes running to the boundary for four runs. So did Ryan and he seemed disappointed when it appeared that they wouldn’t make it there and he’d have to run between the wickets for singles. Ryan ran faster, however, when encouraged by his father’s roars from the boundary “Run Ryan, run!” and he posted some big scores.

Jack Nisbet – Jack too played in the Under 8s last year and could have stayed there this year but “played up” into the 9s. Many of our opposition would have preferred that he had stayed in the 8s! Jack started the year as one of the faster bowlers and he worked hard through the season, becoming even faster and more accurate. Jack always opened the bowling and terrified the opposition with his speed. Jack is a spectacular batsman too, normally batting at 6 with Kieran. Sometimes his big hits (he cannot be bothered to play defensively) will bring a 4, but unfortunately sometimes he will sky one for an easy catch. No doubt he will work as hard at improving this area of his game too.

Brendan Quirk – Another Under 8 from last year, Brendan is a good listener and obedient. Consequently, he did exactly what the coach told him and his bowling and batting improved immeasurably over the season. By the end he was bowling straight as an arrow and he had a classic batting style. While Brendan didn’t score many runs, he often opened the batting (with Ben or Bailey) so as to frustrate the opposition bowlers – they couldn’t get him out easily. As the coach said, as Brendan “grows into his body” his good technique will benefit him for the future.

Bailey Todd – Bailey is another player who improved massively over the season. As a batsman Bailey sometimes found it difficult to resist the temptation to have a big swing at the ball and consequently he often gave his wicket away cheaply. In spite of this Bailey was good-natured about it all and seemed to enjoy opening the batting with Brendan or Ben. But it was as a bowler that Bailey really made his mark in the side. He has an idiosyncratic style which seems to scream “this guy won’t get any wickets today” and that seems to lull the opposition into a false sense of security. We often used him to get the breakthrough against skilful batsmen when the other bowlers were struggling temporarily.

What a fantastic effort in our first competitive season, finishing as runners-up in the competition. Although we lost the Grand Final to a much better team on the day (KP Red,) we did beat them convincingly earlier in the season falling four wickets short of an outright win.

We lost only one game during the main season with two drawn games due to weather – both of which I am confident we would have won. UH Lee was also the only Under 11's side to achieve an outright win taking the final wicket with only four balls remaining in the game.

While we are not a very strong batting side, our bowling is outstanding and on a number of occasions we defended rather low totals to achieve great wins, including in the semi-finals where we took the last wicket with only eight balls and four runs left. With 182 U11 players in the HKHDC, we have three bowlers in the top 10 and five in the top 20.

I'd like to thank the players for their enthusiasm throughout the year and the parents for their support and for getting the boys to training. I would especially like to acknowledge the contributions of David Fergusson our coach and umpire, George Symons our scorer, Steve Godbee and Matt Knox our relieving umpires and finally Simone Murray our manager.

Allan Murray – Assistant Coach

Dan Baker – A great all-rounder and perhaps the most enthusiastic player in the side. Dan is one of our three wicket-keepers, is one of our top 5 bowlers and batters, and is an outstanding fielder. It is rare for a ball to beat him to the boundary and his strong throwing arm always has the ball returning directly to the stumps.

Matthew Browne – His first season in cricket, Matthew is a fast and accurate bowler taking 13 wickets in the season. His dedication to the game is second to none and on a couple of occasions either did not go on a family getaway or had his parents drive him the couple of hours to be at the game on Saturday morning, then drove back after the game.

When asked to organise the third Brisbane tour in five trips away I was well aware of the challenges faced in making the tour a success. I even think I highlighted these in my last report. However I felt the allure of watching the First Ashes Test would be key points that would make this tour attractive. To make it more attractive we also decided to stay at the hotel we stayed at back in 2006 thus ensuring an attractive in price. As an organiser I also looked at including some iconic Brisbane locations for some of our group functions.

Having arrived one day prior to the group to assist in the orientation of the group well namely the guys who were attracted by Jetstar's \$39.00 early morning special. The weather forecast for the week was rain, rain and more rain. My initial thoughts were here we go again. 2008 revisited or this the movie "Ground Hog Day"? This fear proved to be allayed with the only rain recorded on the Wednesday morning where no cricket of any sort was planned.

Our first night dinner was held at the Breakfast Creek hotel. A surprise for the group was that former club member Peter Denton who now resides in Northern NSW had agreed to attend this dinner. This was organised without the group knowing and the pleasant surprise of seeing Peter again was well received by the group who had played with Peter. To see the surprise looks well worth keeping the secret in organising this.

Our first match was played against Albany Creek Cricket Club who are based in the Northern Suburbs of Brisbane metropolitan area. This fixture was organised by Richard Arnott who has an old neighbour – Craig Mills who now plays for the club and were keen to give us a game. And boy were they keen to give us a game after amassing 199 runs off their allotted over's and rolling us for 90. Special mention should be given to Calen Ledger filling in for us who bowled and batted with enthusiastically for us and gave his uncle Craig Henson an opportunity to play in the same team as his nephew. Well worth a day off school. The post match presentations were well received and with Craig Mills having the bragging rights until our next fixture. It should also be mentioned that Ray Lees umpired this fixture as he was unable to play any cricket due to injury. This gesture was appreciated by all.

Our second fixture was against Queensland Wanderers Club at Dauth Park Beenleigh one of the leading first grade grounds in Brisbane. In a tightly contested fixture Wanderers chased down our score of 133 with seven wickets down a tightly contested match and played by and large in Great Spirit. We had the opportunity to play against former Queensland Sheffield Shield players John Bell and Dennis Lillie. Again there was good comradely after the fixture and anecdotes exchanged about the game and cricketing experiences.

With the playing commitments behind us most of the group enjoyed the day off prior to test match commencing. Activities ranging from relaxing by the pool, playing bowls and in the tour managers case just lying on his bed for most of the day. Must have been something he ate the night before or just tired with ensuring that the tour went well.

We were fortunate to see the one best day's of the Ashes from an Australian perspective as well as seeing Peter Siddle take a hat-trick on the first day of the series and some good dour test cricket on day two. I will not bore you with bland test match statistics. However most of the group enjoyed both days of the test match which has been one of the key attractions of all the tours organised so far.

On the final evening our final night dinner was held at Deering's Restaurant at Story Bridge Hotel and fortunately that the tour manager booked the restaurant and not the Bistro like he had originally intended as the Bistro turns into a Nightclub on Friday nights. An enjoyable meal was had by all reflecting what we had done over the week. All agreed that another successful tour had been achieved. Special mention should also be given to Craig Henson in helping out in the driving when Keven Rowilson had postpone his arrival on the tour due to family illness. David Lea was very positive in recruitment in the early stages of the organising of the tour.

Having seen the footage on all the news media in January of the damage caused by the floods it is hard to visualise and comprehend to believe what we did and achieved in the week that we were up there. I have checked with our contacts and all are safe and well and have few anecdotes to tell.

At the time of writing report 23rd March 11 no decision has been reached on next season's tour. Having met in February it was decided to follow our usual path and wait for Cricket Australia to release next summer's dates and try and fit our tour around an Australian test summer. There is conjecture whether we should go to Melbourne for the Australian Open tennis and combined with the possibility of a One Day International as well as two fixtures would offer a good formula for a tour given that the Melbourne test has been always based around Boxing Day since 1980 which is not usually a friendly time to travel due to family commitments for most. Whilst different to the formula we have used of the last five tours it is an innovation that is worth trying. We are also looking a Far North Queensland trip to coincide with a possible test match. It has also been suggested that a "Country Weekend" be organised for a trip to a centre such as Bathurst. We are undertaking a feasibility study for the viability for a three and half week tour of England in 2013 as well some of the World War One battlefields of Northern France. We currently have a promotion advertising \$50 a week for two years will get you a trip to England. A decision will be made by December 12 whether we proceed with this venture. We will also be having our traditional fixture with the Kookaburra's on 7th August 11 and a fixture against a Kenthurst Selection Eleven on 3rd July 11. On future tours we will also promote our facilities being available for winter tours to coincide with possible State of Origin, Wallaby test matches and Swan games for our interstate visitors to organise tours around.

It should be noted that over the last 12 months we completed a great deal of work on improving our page on the Kenthurst Cricket Club website. We have also entered a "Mission Statement" outlining the values that we stand for. I am sure this will improved further. Craig Henson and Col Griffin are always helpful in uploading information when requested with Craig adding quite a number of photos.

Finally I would like to thank the Kenthurst Cricket Club for their support and the clubs in our association that support our tours. To achieve what we do we always need support from all avenues. I do hope this will continue in the future.
