Our U16's boys had another fun year, they are clearly a team who love their cricket and they're all really top kids. I was able to get out and watch a number of their matches and with this being their final year of juniors, I could see a number of them succeeding in seniors' cricket for years to come. I was able to watch a number of matches from all the teams and thoroughly enjoyed doing so. Being able to introduce myself and regularly show my support as a senior member of the Club will hopefully help the kids feel welcome when they move into the seniors' competition. It was however a bit disappointing that there wasn't more support shown from other members of our seniors competition.

A Grade Cap Speech

A new initiative began this year where a list was compiled of all those who have represented A grade for KUHCC. Each current player received a cap with their number embroidered on it. Upon receiving his cap, Brendon Lowndes wrote the following speech in appreciation of receiving his cap. Time didn't permit for the speech to be delivered in full so it was instead decided to print into the yearbook.

Dane, thank you so much for organising this. I can only take a guess at how much time it would have taken to complete. When you initially announced that you were going to go through every yearbook going back to 1896 being our foundation year, I initially thought, 'what's the point?'. After being given these caps and thinking about what it means to receive one, I can see why you've done this. I've taken the pride playing in the top grade of the best club in the world for granted. It is truly a privilege and the makeup of the list of names and the order in which they were selected just reinforces this. Kenthurst has had thousands and thousands and thousands of people play during its 120 year history of which only a few hundred people have had the privilege of being selected to play A grade.

About 15-20 years ago I received a baggy green and yellow cap and over the years it disintegrated to almost nothing. Literal blood and sweat were in that cap and when it came out of the washing machine in a thousand pieces I was devastated. Dane, you've now given me something new that I'll treasure for the rest of my life and so many other members in the club's past and present I'm certain will do the same.

Each cap that has been presented to us has a unique number which is each person's place in the Club. If you go upstairs to the clubhouse you'll see the honour board with names of the men all of whom have a number of their own who made the club what it is today. On the honour board you'll also notice sections where it says 'wartime recess'. Let us think about what that means. To me it means that there were men in the Club that fought and who knows, possibly made the ultimate sacrifice so we can have the freedom that we have today. The freedom to be able to come together each Saturday and play, what in my view is the greatest game of all for the greatest club of all, to have a BBQ with meat supplied of course by CHOP artisan butchery and the bread of course supplied by Bakers Delight and then go to The Hillside Hotel after the game to celebrate our wins and commiserate our losses (I had to get that in there, you gotta keep your sponsors happy. I tried to fit in our other sponsors: Carpet Court, Everwilling Health and Fitness, Hills Uniforms and Geometric Electrical and the rest but I couldn't think of how to do this). No other game teaches you the life skills that cricket does and no other game is elegant yet brutal, long yet exciting, slow yet full of action and no other game genuinely rewards gentlemenly like behaviour. You rarely see people in other sports of such grace and class like Alistair Cooke who is respected the world over.

This cap also has our Club logo on it. A logo that is beautifully simplistic. The banksia emblem is a symbol of how the suburb of Kenthurst is a rural area with bushland all around. It's the scenery that provides such a beautiful backdrop to the greatest place on earth to watch the greatest game on earth being up on the balcony watching your mates. Today we're playing [insert team] and this is exactly what Park Cricket is all about. It's our local community of Kenthurst playing against the community of [insert club]. Without Park Cricket, you wouldn't have this coming together of communities and no other sport provides as much opportunity to be able to converse with the opposition and make new mates along the way.

If it wasn't for Kenthurst I would never have met such a truly great man like Dave Lea. A man that has worked hard all his life, married a beautiful lady in Leonie and raised well-rounded hard-working sons of strong character all while still playing cricket for 50 consecutive seasons. I first started playing at Kenthurst when I was 7 and Dave Lea coached me from U11's through to U16's. He didn't have any children in our team but he put his hand up to coach each year as there were no volunteers from the group of parents. Dave has done so much for me personally and has instilled into me the idea that the club is more than just a Club, it's a family and growing up, I saw Dave more often than I saw my own Dad. An example Dave's generosity and willingness to help anyone in the Club is when he helped me by doing a free building inspection on the house that I eventually bought with my wife which is the house that I live in today. The help that Dave has given to me over the past 27 years is something I'll be forever grateful for. Dave is the sort of man who that if something needed doing, he got it done. I'm glad that we're at Kenthurst today so I can point to the clubhouse as an example. Dave and his Dad Lionel Lea and a group of other men in the club got together and built it themselves for no other reason but for their love of the Club. It is an honour to be able to use the facilities built by these members. If I can achieve half as much as what Dave has then I'll be a very happy man. This cap and it's logo is a symbol of the hard work that people like Dave put in for 120 years.

I get it, I'm a bit of an oddball and a loner but I'm so grateful that the Club doesn't discriminate and welcomes anyone who wants to play cricket. It's so great that a weirdo like myself can still be accepted into the Club. I love how Kenthurst is so accepting of anyone who wants to play cricket and contains so many people who are willing to put in the work in order to facilitate this. Our youngest members are 4 years old and our eldest members are in their 70's, containing all sorts of people, all of whom are welcome so much so to the point where Andre Bertollo even donated his full kit to one of our weirdos. Alex, I'm so grateful for what you have done with the team bringing a level of talent and professionalism that hasn't existed since A grade last won the premiership. We now have a team of fair dinkum superstars and it's only a matter of time before we get to hold up the A grade trophy. Dane, back to these caps, they are another reason along with the 68858863380411563996..... reasons why I was and am still happy to help vote you in as the Club President. You understood the role that pride has in running a club and in winning games.

Pride and my love for the Club is the reason I'm able to work 20,30,40 hours a week on club administration, sometimes attending up to 5 meetings in a single week. It's why I'm willing to drive for close to 2 hours for no other reason than to pick up a playing shirt for a mate so he too can share in wearing the Club logo with pride. It's why I'm happy to stand at Dural Mall for 8 hours handing out flyers to encourage new kids to get into cricket. When these kids do sign up and play, the delight that I get from helping kids learning new skills again fills me with tremendous pride. There's nothing more rewarding than seeing a kids smile shine through like a sunbeam after finally being able to perform a new skill after trying so hard for so long as well as seeing the joy that they get out of playing the greatest game of all. The reasons for how pride plays a role in a club goes on and on and Dane, again I'm truly grateful for you having the vision to see this and then having the drive to carry it through. This might all sound a bit much and anyone outside of the Club might think that I'm being overly dramatic and hyperbolic in that it's just another cricket Club. For me however, the house I grew up in is on this very road and I know of nothing else apart from being a member of the Kenthurst Cricket Family. It's why I've asked the most important people in my life to be here to share this occasion. I literally have no memory of life where I wasn't a member of this Club. Being a member of this amazing Club is a massive part of my life and has formed a major part of my identity, I rarely leave the house without some kind of Kenthurst merchandise whether it's a hat on weekends or carrying my Kenthurst backpack to work (both of which are available for purchase by the way and just quietly, how's that for a sales pitch?).

The great man Homer Simpson who in explaining his gratitude in the episode where he was accepted to the secret Stonecutters Society said the following: 'I've never felt so accepted in all my life. These people looked deep within my soul and assigned me a number based on the order in which I joined'. Whilst this was written with the intention of being humerous, there is an element of truth in it for how I feel in receiving this cap. In summary, this cap which we've been given consists of two major components: a unique number identifying each individual and a Club logo identifying the collection of individuals that form what this Club is today. I will be wearing it with tremendous pride and I ask that those who have their own cap do the same. To everyone who came out to share this moment with me and remain patient while I bore you to death with my words, I thank you all so much.

Having been forced under 'ridiculous' restrictions to almost half of the team two rounds into the season- despite having not won a game yet , all the boys gave it a genuine crack despite being behind the eight ball from the get go. A little summary and insight into what each individual player brought to the team across the season.

His 50 (retired out) against WPHC was a standout knock and undoubtedly would have won us the game had he been aloud to bat on. The ever reliable wicket keeper also took 8 vital catches and I have no doubt his witty antics behind the pegs led to many more dismissals.

Nick Summerhays (117 runs @ 16.71, 18 wickets @ 13.31, 5 catches)

Nicko 'the hunch' Summerhays is one of the most naturally talented yet frustrating cricketers I have come across! (Yes nicko that's a compliment) Scores of 26, 23, 22 and 21 n.o show you most certainly have the ability with the bat you just need to grind away and shift up a gear or two so you can get the 60s and 70s you are capable of! As a first change bowler you could be relied upon to not only swing the ball but take wickets and keep the batsmen tied down. 5/41 were your best figures but the 3/17 and 3/32 in the penultimate game of the season knocking over the top order in both innings was the clear highlight as it showed you could step up when the team needed you. Ever so reliable in the field with the absolute 'trash' spoken not only getting under the skin of the batsmen but your own team aswell!

Anthony Eastwood (231 runs @ 46.20, 1 catch)

Anthony 'angry' Eastwood what an absolute revelation you became this season. The hard hitting explosive middle order batsmen took the game away from you at the blink of an eye. Your 104 not out which was hit off 63 balls against Hornsby (who in my opinion had the best bowling attack we had come up against in the competition) was incredible. I've never heard the park cricket bench erupt like it did when the ball kept sailing over the fence! An unbeaten 83 not out against Asquith Rugby League was match defining and lead us too an important victory. In the field you were constantly getting under the nose of the batsmen and many wickets were taken due to your intelligent cricket mind games.

David Thomas (139 runs @ 19.86, 0 catches)

Another improving cricketer amongst the club Dave got pushed up a grade this season and quickly become one of the first picked players each week. A monster 161 run partnership with his partner in crime (angry) against Hornsby was the highlight of the season & although being outscored (51 n.o) he certainly didn't look second best with his square of the wicket cricket shots some of the classiest and most powerful throughout the competition. In the field Dave will tell you himself he probably saved as many runs as he scored with his left and right kneecaps! You could always rely on no runs being scored on the turf through the mid on region as he made it his own throughout the year.

Luke Brant (149 runs @ 13.55, 25 wickets @ 14.32, 3 catches)

Stepped up and captained the side this season and certainly led by example. 50 (retired out) was ground out off 53 overs and as they say that's the job of an opening bat to take the shine off the pill!

Doug Gemmell (73 runs @ 24.33, 8 wickets @ 25.88, 8 catches)

Asked to bat number 3 to steady after an early wicket Dougy provided the goods with a gutsy 22. Asked to come in at number 9 in a run chase that went down to the wire he hit 25 n.o. Daniel Moss (15 runs @ 5.00, 8 wickets @ 18.13, 5 catches)

I hope everyone reads this one carefully because although cricket is a statistically based game this proves that stats infact DO lie! Daniel Moss was out and out the best opening bowler in the competition this season- that good the batsmen couldn't hit him! 8 wickets do not do you justice whatsoever and I could feel your frustrating from first slip as the ball constantly beat the outside edge. Round 2 you picked up 2/25 off 25 overs showing the batsmen just couldn't hit you. With the bat chances were few and far between but your 11 n.o off 4 balls had the boys in the sheds buzzing! Safe as houses in the field picking up 5 crucial chances and showed off his hidden talent of wicket keeping with immediate success in snagging a couple of caught behinds !

C-Reserve 2018/2019 Season

Narendra also secured the title of the worst run out of the year somehow turning an easy two into a no scoring runout. The bowling highlight for the season was the highly unexpected Hat trick from Juan Becker who looked more surprise than anyone when the umpire raised his finger for the third straight ball.

In terms of batting the Inshaw father son duo combined with the highest partnership of 144m (please note Dad ended up with 104 no v's the son who scraped together a noble 78). Neeraj was mister consistency throughout the season scoring the most runs of anyone for the season (277) other half centurions include John Marks and Jordan Bragg. Harold definitely was our go to person to increase the run rate, scoring quickly by dispatching the opposition bowlers over the fence at will.

Wicket keeping was a major strength with virtually nothing getting past the diving Jordan Bragg and again mister consistency Neeraj Gupta, both sharing the 12 caught behinds for the season. In summary it was a missed opportunity – the side was highly competitive and if we can come out of the next offseason with a bit more momentum then the finals are definitely within reach.

We Played Cricket, we had Fun, and we conquered D2s

As I write it is has been two days since we won the grand final. An email that I received from one of my team members the day after the grand final sums up what playing cricket is all about at our level. Please find below the main paragraph of the email –

A season is made up of magic moments and team spirit ...and as premiers we had more magic moments than all others. Everyone one of you guys had magic moments that turned a game to our advantage - they are etched in my mind. They included...

- ... a special catch or runout that changed momentum.
- ... saving a 4 in the field or reducing that 2 into a 1 or saving a single.
- ... running at the crease to get that quick single or double.
- saving a game through defending your wicket.
- encouraging your mate from the field or stands.
- getting that wicket when we needed it most or runs to change a game.
- plus, many more.

The author of that email was Craig Roy who was in his first season of cricket to quote him since he was Liam Finucane's age. Liam was in his first season with the club at the age of 17. Craig is in his 50s. Our team attracted some unwanted criticism from some of the other Clubs due our playing personnel. However, most Clubs had their main man. Further our team had over the years had been faced the might of many players that had been too good for our grade. I felt to be competitive we would have to have players to counter the stronger players that we faced. That said and done the D2 competition was still played in its usual spirit with most games against opponents treated like reconnecting with old friends. The fact that five teams out of six went into the final round not knowing if they would be competing in the semi finals and the final went down to last session of the season is testament on how close the competition was. I pay tribute to Thornleigh for their performance in the final. If the final was my last game, it was good that they be my opponents and the spirit in which the game was played was also a testament to both teams.

If you were to ask me how I rated out team's, chances rated before the season began, I would have been despondent as I had two players leave our club that I felt would have been part of the mix for the season. As season went on, we had players join the club and D2s suited them. They became integral parts of the team and from players that had not played cricket for 40 years or players who could not get a game as their previous Club had too many players in the squad. Given that all the statistics are entered in the yearbook I will not bore you with the statistics as they are in the publication that this article is written. Kenthurst Banksia Report

We formed the Banksias under the instruction of Kenthurst Cricket Club (as it was known back then) to compete in the 1989 Alternative Ashes. We had four great tours to England over the next twelve years. However, with the 2005 tour being cancelled due to commercial constraints, we decided to reinvent ourselves with a domestic program which has worked quite well since 2006 and were able to also generate interest to have an England tour in 2013. As a tour organiser I can only say I was disappointed with events this year from two perspectives.

At the Kenthurst and Upper Hills Cricket Club presentation night I had about twelve expressions of interest with this in mind I purchased fifteen tickets for the first two days of the First test with India in Adelaide. However, on departure day there were only a group of nine travelling to Adelaide. This meant that one of the fixtures was cancelled as the opposition could not find players for the game. Further, without the generosity of the senior members of the party I would have been out of pocket by a large amount.

On a positive side the members of the group who went to Adelaide enjoyed themselves immensely. To make up for the shortfall in fixtures we organised day trips, walking tours of Adelaide and Adelaide Oval as well as a day trip to the Adelaide Hills' wineries sampling some of the wares of the area and finishing up with a lunch in Hahndorf. Needless to say, the group was quite dormant that evening. We had a fun fixture with Parra Hills who provided us with some players to have a great day of cricket. For the record Parra Hills won by a huge margin but the spirit in which the game was played was quite enjoyable. E.g. I knew I was clearly out caught behind and was walking off but was called back to the crease to have a longer bat. We were well entertained after the game with interest being in a Kenthurst v Parra Hills 8 ball competition. David Lea starring in this field after the rigours of umpiring our fixture. So, the Banksias did win something on the day. The rest of the tour was centred around the first two days of the test match with India. The tour ended with a meal at the Passage to India restaurant. Those who attended had a great time.

Concurrently, with the organisation of the Adelaide trip, I decided to run a feasibility study for an England tour to coincide with the Ashes series commencing in August. Having a database of 60 players I did not see it as encroaching on the Adelaide tour. Further there was two schools of thought on the tour that some of the Adelaide tourists would, after enjoying that tour, might decide to undertake the England tour. Also, some players on the England tour would not have contemplated going to Adelaide. After having an initial interest of nine people, only one player came through with a deposit. What was more disappointing only two players had the courtesy to advise me that they were not able to go on the tour. It is also disappointing that since I have decided to cancel the tour there are about four players who have expressed an interest in the tour.

During the season I expressed my concerns that the Banksias tours are not generating the interest they had in the past. Several reasons were given from the timing of trip in relation leading up to the Christmas break and the taking of leave and the like and the reluctance of employers to grant leave. I will be holding a forum later in the year after Cricket Australia releases its dates next season to see the feasibility for a tour to be organised.
