UNDER 9 TEAM REPORT

What a fantastic first season of cricket our youngest and newest KUHCC recruits had. There was such a huge learning curve over the season, and I am proud to say that every single boy has grown over this time. With the majority of the boys never having picked up a bat before, under the guidance of Ben and many home practises with the dads (thanks Dads!), we progressed from chucking to bowling, missing balls to fours and even some sixes. Our fielding had a great boost over the season as well, with many outfield throw ins hitting the mark beautifully resulting in numerous run outs.

September 2015- The beginning of the season saw our boys facing some already well established teams. We valiantly held our own, not being discouraged by the run difference at the end of each match. Each week the boys were enthusiastic and were starting to really bond as a team. The continual losses never tainted their love for the sport, nor their willingness to keep on trying. Our first win of the season came at the end of November against Kissing Point Blue, with a narrow 69/67. This gave them a much needed boost in their confidence and their celebration was that of winning a grand final. Our next win mid-Feb, was a slightly more convincing win 56/42 against Berowra Watson with our last two matches of the season, rounding out our season beautifully with back to back wins, a very well deserved 104/43 against CHRSL Blue & 70/51 against ARL.

It will be great to see these boys back playing together again next year, as I can only see them growing in skill and strength now.

Callum Dong- Throughout the season, Callum was an enthusiastic and vocal member of the u9's. His batting skills increased, seeing him have 6 not outs throughout all his innings this season. He has concentrated on his bowling, taking instruction well and taking four wickets, which is outstanding for someone that had never bowled.

Ethan Hall- Ethan brought much fire and determination to the team, when his bat connected with the ball, the driving force behind it was intense. We all loved his passion on field and the evolution of his bowling saw 6 wickets fall under him, he also bowled a maiden which at this age is an incredible feat.

Hamish Nicolson - Hamish started the season with some strong skills, confident with both the bat and ball. His smile is infectious as he steps onto the crease. This season saw him with 9 innings not out and one maiden-wicket bowled and an amazing 13 wickets taken over the season- with 3 in one game against WPH! He also held the best partnership score with Zac, the two of them combining for 42, followed by third combined 32 with Lucas. His consistency has been a great strength for the rest of the team.

Jack Cameron- Jack grew from a timid boy that just loved his cricket to a powerhouse over the season, around Christmas time his skill and power had a significant growth. 2016 saw Jack come into his own, with a highest personal and team best of 22 runs against Hornsby Green. He has shown great strength in batting with 7 fours, 3 sixes and 7 not outs in all his innings. Not to be outdone, his bowling is also strong with a maiden and 8 wickets taken during the season. His confidence and love for cricket has grown so much this season, I've loved watching his performance on the field.

Liam Stanbridge- Liam is big personality in a little form, with 8 not outs in the season, he held consistent form with the bat. As the season progressed, his bowling skills were honed. At the start of the season the average run rate against his overs bowled was 10, this was reduced to 4.9 by the end of the season, with seven wickets taken, a great effort and I cannot wait to see this average drop even more.

Lucas Archer - Lucas was another strong starter at the beginning of the season. 2nd and 3rd Combined batting scores for the team with 34 combined with Max and 32 combined with Hamish, he received 9 not outs in his innings. His bowling also showed skill, with 10 wickets taken and each over bowled was done with determination and drive. Such a quiet achiever on the field, Lucas was a pleasure to have at training and games.

Max Antunac - Max started the season with the biggest grin, which continued to light up the field till the last match. What he lacked in skills he had in spades of enthusiasm. Then the skills started to develop throughout the season, with him finishing strongly at the last match with a total of -1 runs against his bowled overs. A brilliant finish for someone who had never bowled a ball back in September. His got his eye in with his batting too, having 7 not outs across his innings and having a combined partnership of 34 with Lucas.

His batting is also progressing with 3 not outs during his innings. The most memorable day was towards the end of the season, where Rory was captain, a job that he took very seriously. That game, he wanted to be involved in every play that occurred, regardless of where he was fielding. His enthusiasm and joy that day were infectious.

Zac Cromie- with a little experience prior to the season start, Zac was a small but big contributor to the team. Strong in his bowling, he took 10 wickets, bowled 2 Maiden-Wickets, a Maiden and an average of 3.3 runs per over bowled. In batting he was consistent with 11 innings not out and the top partnership of 42 with Hamish. On the field he was vocal and enthusiastic ("Walk In!"), backing that up with some accurate throw ins that hit the mark.

I cannot wait to watch these boys grow as cricketers and as people, it's been my pleasure to manage the team this year. Thanks to Ben Nicolson for volunteering his time to lead the boys all through the season and a huge thank you to all the parents who stepped up this year in scoring, umpiring, generally helping out and for being courteous, encouraging and supportive of the whole team. It certainly made my job a lot easier!

Captains Report Commencing Round 7

Round 7 – 12th of December, 2015 vs Glenorie at Kenthurst Park, one dayer

Having lost 2 in a row and suffering a wash out, it was imperative that we were able to take a few points with us into the Christmas break. Having our first game back on turf, there was plenty of excitement amongst the playing group. Past turf pitches at Kenthurst have always provided a little something for the bowlers in the start of the days play with it flattening out making it great to bat on in the afternoon, and with a tinge of green on the wicket we won the toss and elected to bowl. Round 8 – 19th of December, 2015 vs Hornsby at Mills Park, one dayer

Having lost the toss and sent into bowl on a lovely 40 degree day, we found it difficult to restrain Hornsby as they batter their way to 195. With good bowling performances from Stewart Hodges 3/39 off 8, alongside Doug Gemmel and Nic Summerhay's economical spells we kept Hornsby down to 195 on a very fast outfield. With the addition of Charles Ivey into the batting lineup, we were feeling slightly confident over the run chase in front of us. With the loss of an early wicket it brought Charles to the crease, which provided a strong 47 run partnership with Stew Hodges. A good partnership between Tom Lee and Charles of 72 kept us in a dominant position to win the game. With wickets falling at unwanted intervals, we were unable to chase down the total being left 3 runs short with 4 wickets in hand. A great solo effort from Charles Ivey scoring 84 not out was a positive boost for the team leading into the start of the New Year.

Round 9 – 9th of January, vs Mount Colah at Dural Park, one dayer

Now knowing that we needed to win every game to be in contention of finals cricket, we knuckled down to the task ahead. Batting first we built our way to a defendable total of 5/169 on a very slow outfield, with good batting performances from Charles Ivey (40), Tom Lee (33*) and Nic Dolly (29*). Knowing we had a decent total to defend we were able to play an attacking style of cricket to stem the flow of runs. Stewart Hodges produced his best spell of bowling for the season taking 6/12 off 8 overs and changed the game completely. With a good supporting role from Doug Gemmel, we were able to keep Mount Colah to 10/70. With Mount Colah coming 2nd on the ladder at that time, it was a great confidence booster for the team.

Round 10- 16th January, vs Berowra at Mount Kuringai oval, one dayer

Losing the toss and being sent into bowl, we knew that restricting the runs of the Berowra team would lead to false shots and wickets. With a damaging opening spell from Nic Summerhays and Doug Gemmel, we were able to grab a few early wickets to really tighten the screws on the opposition. With the magic man Stewart Hodges being able to come in after a damaging opening session, he was able to grab 3 wickets and keep the pressure right on the opposition. With a cheeky full toss wicket, including a dropped catch off his own bowling, Jackson Lofts was able to make an impact with his right arm loopers. With wickets falling regularly it was left to Nic Summerhays to clean up the tail and end up with figures of 5/24 off 7.1 overs. Leaving Berowra with 10/110.

Being a small total, we took a very aggressive approach in obtaining these runs. With a rocketing start and fantastic stroke play, we were able to chase down the total within 17overs, with little cameos from both Tom Lee and Jackson Lofts.

Round 11- 23rd January vs WPHCC at Dural Park, one dayer

With 2 wins under our belt and confidence high amongst the team, we knew that playing 3rd place West Penno would be a winnable game for us. Winning the toss and electing to bat on a very slow Dural Park, we were able to edge our way to 9/135. With his best knock of the season, young newly acclaimed opener Jackson Lofts hit his way to 56 and left us in a dominant position to defend the total. Late hitting from Andre Bertollo and Karl Anchique helped set up the total. Having a half decent total to defend we knew that applying scoreboard pressure and taking our chances were going to win us the match. Taking an early wicket brought about a damaging 75 run partnership from the opposition leaving us in a difficult situation. With aggressive batting from Stewart Hodges (37), we were able to chase down their total to gain a first innings win. Day 2 was going to be difficult, needing a further 10 wickets to play finals cricket. We were unable to take all wickets required, however Glenorie decided to declare leaving us 202 for victory in 20 overs. With a near impossible task ahead of us, we struggled in the 2nd innings and were dismissed for 8/89 with a few players having to leave due to other commitments. We were able to achieve a first innings win, but unfortunately were denied our opportunity at playing in the finals. Bowling to him in the nets surprised me he didn't score more runs. He finished the season off well in the last game and looked at his most comfortable out in the middle.

Further Paul Brunner of Barton Hill Travel assisted in the organisation of the fixtures for the Adelaide tour.

Fixture V Kookaburras 20th September 2015 – Whilst I was enjoying the hospitality and cuisine that Karon Beach offers poor Craig was burdened with the organising of the fixture. Whilst the weather was perfect in Phuket it would seem that Mother Nature interfered with the game equally poised. The hoodoo of the VAT 69 Cup continues. We will continue with this fixture and hopefully next season we can win this trophy which has not been in Banksia hands since 2008.

Adelaide Tour – To say I had concerns in regards to fixtures is an understatement. Due to family commitments I was unable to arrive in Adelaide until the second day of the tour. I asked Craig Henson taken on the tour manager role for the tour and he excelled in this responsibility.

Our opening night was the now traditional first night of the tour dinner which this year was held at the Royal Oak Hotel which was opposite the Adelaide Inn which we stayed at in North Adelaide. By all accounts a good time was had by all. Craig also organised a tour of the Adelaide Oval as well a nine hole three par golf for the morning before our fixture against SA Churches in a 20/20 format. This fixture was organised to fill the gap that was created due to scheduling of the test match to begin on the Friday. On most tours we have had an itinerary of two games on Monday and Tuesday as a free day on the Wednesday and going to the test match on the Thursday and Friday. The Churches team compiled a very competitive score of 167 off their 20 overs however we fell well short in our chase being all out off our 20 for 102.

The second day of our tour was spent visiting the wineries of the Barossa Valley. An enjoyable day was had by all. We visited six wineries as well as a lovely lunch in a typical country hotel in the Barossa Valley. Our taste for the fine wines of the regions was enhanced and several bottles being shipped home by our team members and lots of laughs were had particularly at the last winery.

The third and fourth days of the tour were spent playing the two fixtures both in scenic venues. The first game of the tour was against Goodwood Cricket Club who like the Banksias has toured United Kingdom. Our bowlers did a great job to restrict them to 196 off their 40 overs. This issue has been raised to Cricket Australia who are appreciative of this issue. We are also looking at a couple more local fixtures. Two of our travellers on this last trip were from Coogee Cricket Club and are interested in hosting a match with us this summer. I am thinking around the Sydney test would be an opportune time. We also waiting for the scheduling of the tests for next summer before making a decision for our tour for next summer.
