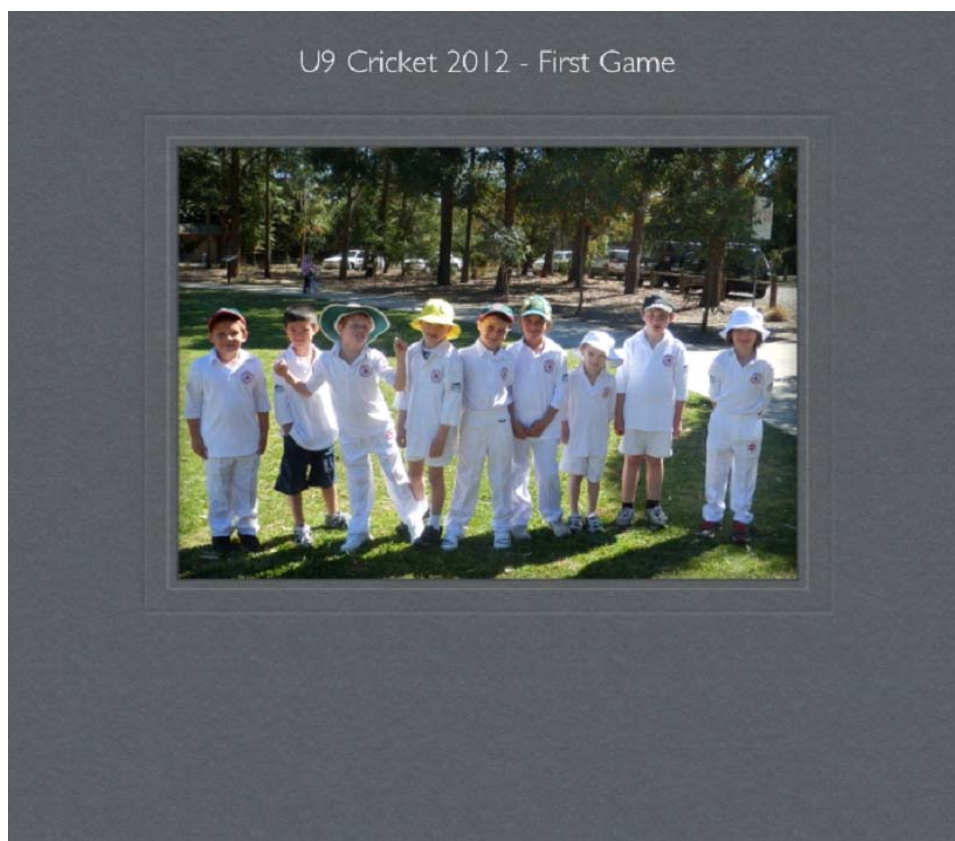
## **Under 9 Kenthurst Upper Hills - 2012 - 13**

## Report on C1 Grade 2012/13

I tried to tell them that cricket was much more important but my wife showed me the error of my ways!

So, there we were a Motley Crew and to cap it off I was asked to skipper the side and, considering the last time I captained a cricket team was in England circa 1986, I was proud but pensive. It didn't help when I turned up at the game and nearly turned away as I could not see anyone I knew. I have been with the Club for aeons but who were this lot? I have a terrible memory for names and faces but I also had to work out what these lads could do. In those days it was a bit of a lottery as to who could bat bowl, score, umpire or none/some of the above. I learnt never to trust volunteers but if someone is going to put their hand up to do a "dirty job", then all I can say is "thanks"!

I soon discovered we had a pool of some very talented players. There were these pimply young 'uns, ie. Billy the Kid who needed to be tied down in a breeze in case he blew away – He blew away a lot of the opposition when this Baby Faced Killer appeared at the crease and showed timing and maturity not often seen in one so young amongst men a lot older. BtK is a great keeper and with coaching and listening skills will make a brilliant keeper/batsman in the higher Grades.
